From O.K.Bucket Company asking for fifty buckets, referred to committee on Fire Department


From David Williams to erect frame building within the forbidden district on Washington street. Not granted.

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Secretary's Report

The lots Nos. 35 & 36 in Block No. 98 purchased by City Council in 1849, for the purpose of erecting a school house in 6th Ward, being considered unsuitable for the purpose, because of its proximity to an iron foundry and steam boiler manafactory, was directed to be sold by the Council Dec.6, 1851, which has been according done by the Councilman of 6th Ward for the sum of \$700 (being an advance of \$300 on cost) to R.R. Underhill who paid \$300 in hand and gave note for \$400. payable in one year with interest from 1st January 1852. Gave Underhill title Bond.

Mr. Woodward selected in lieu of the lots sold, lots 3 & 4 according to Edmund Browning Subdivision of Out Block North for which City Council has allowed \$1000. \$600 being paid on purchase and an order on School Fund for \$400 payable January 1st 1853 with interest. A deed was given for said lots, and has been recorded in Recorder's Office."
