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## Secretary's Report

The lots Nos. 35 \& 36 in Block No. 98 purchased by City Council in 1849, for the purpose of erecting a school house in 6th Ward, being considered unsuiteble for the purpose, because of its proximity to an iron foundry and steam boiler manafadtory, was directed to be sold by the Council Dec.6, 1851, which has been eccording done by the Councilman of 6th Ward for the sum of $\$ 700$ (being an advance of ${ }_{\$ / 300} 30$ on cost) to R.R. Underhill who paid $\$ 300$ in hand and gave note for $\$ 400$. payable in one year with interest from lst January 1852. Gave Underhill title Bond.

Mr. Woodward selected in lieu of the lots sold, lots $3 \& 4$ according to Edmund Browning Subdivision of Out Block Jorth for which City Council has allowed $\$ 1000$. $\$ 600$ being paid on purchase and an order on School Fund for $\$ 400$ payable January lst 1853 with interest. A deed was givem for said lots, and has been recorded in Recorder's Office."
