"To the Hon City Council of the City of Indianapolis, The undersigned desirous to build, and accupy for mechanical purposes, a vault, under the sidewalk, in front of the building about to be erected, on the alley side aflot (4) in square fifty six (56) respectfully ask your honorable body the privilege to occupy, at the Sputh East Corner of the building, a space not to exceed two feet in width by five fleet in length off of the edge of the alley as an entrance way to this vallt. This space in width will not exceed that of the opening by which the cellar has always been ventilated, and shall not be greater than that a man may pass down the stairway". S.D.Tomlinson Indianapolis, April 12, 1852.

The prayer of the petition was granted; provided they secure said opening irn railing.

A petition of Wm.Young and others for grading and graveling Michigan Street between Pennsylvania & Meridian Streets; was

On motion, Laid on the table.

On motion of Mr.Louden \$2.68 was allowed Mr.Lupton as the amount paid by him as taxes, over and above what was due having been assessed \$800 too much.

The committee appointed for that purpose, reported plans and specifications with certain alterations reducing the cost of construction of the City School houses, one hundred and seventeen;(\$117) which were received, and, on motion, The committee with instructed, to award said buildings to C.King & Jos.Kennedy at the sum of \$1470 each, and to contract with the parties at that price.

The following resolution was presented, and read: Resolved That the committee be authorized to employ some fit person to superintend the construction of the city school houses at a cost not to exceed three per sent on the cost of construction. 1

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Mr. Edwards moved that three per cent on cost of construction be stricken out."

The ayes and nays being demanded, it was lost as follows:

On motion by Mr.Woodward the resolution was laid upon the table
