That the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) now in Department of Public Health and Charities Child Hygiene Item 31—Food, Fund 317—Other Food Supplies, and the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) now in Department of Public Health and Charities Prenatal and Dental Fund 34—Institutional and Medical, be and the same are hereby transferred therefrom and reappropriated in the total amount of Sixteen Hundred Dollars (\$1600.00) to Department of Public Health and Charities Child Hygiene Item 31—Food, Fund 316—Milk, Cream and Ice Cream.

Section 7. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE transferring moneys from certain funds and reappropriating the same to other designated funds, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

Section 1. That the following transfer and reappropriation of funds be and the same is hereby made in the Department of Public Safety, Police Department budget, viz: Seven Hundred Dollars (700.00) from Item 1—Services, Personal, Fund 11—Salaries and Wages, Regular—Patrolmen First Grade, to Item 3—Supplies, Fund 38—General Supplies.

Section 2. That the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) now in Department of Public Works Administration Item 2—Services Contractual, Fund 24—Printing and Advertising, be and the same is hereby transferred and reappropriated to the following funds in Department of Public Works, Public Buildings budget, viz:

\$500.00 to Item 2—Services, Contractual, Fund 25—Repairs
250.00 to Item 3—Supplies, Fund 34—Institutional and
Medical (Janitor Supplies)
100.00 to Item 3—Supplies, Fund 38—General Supplies
150.00 to Item 4—Materials, Fund 41—Building Materials.

Section 3. That the sum of Six Dollars (\$6.00) be and the same is hereby transferred from Department of Law Item 1, Services, Personal, Fund 11—Salaries and Wages, Regular, and reappropriated to Department of Law Item 5—Current Charges, Fund 55—Subscriptions and Dues.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 98, 1935

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 6 of General Ordinance No. 84, 1932, pertaining to the City Market, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Section 6 of General Ordinance No. 84, 1932, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"Section 6—That Section 492 of General Ordinance No. 121, 1925, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 492—STAND LEASES

Not later than the 15th of December, 1935, and the 1st day of December of each year thereafter, the Market Master shall submit to the Board of Public Safety for its approval an appraisal of the rental value of each stand, such rental to be determined, as near as may be, by the location of the stands, but such value shall not be enhanced by the character of trade its occupant may have established by his personal merit or skill. Thereupon the Board shall enter into contracts with owners or applicants for stands and store rooms on the basis of such last appraisal for annual, semi-annual or monthly periods, rent payments to be made at times fixed by the Board

and to be paid in advance. The year shall begin as of January 1. Provided, that the Board may make lease contracts for store rooms for a longer period than one year but not to exceed three years.

- a. Not more than one stand on the market shall be leased, rented or occupied by any one person, firm or company. Provided, that the Board of Public Safety may, by resolution duly adopted and recorded upon the minutes, authorize the renting of two, three or four stands to the same person, but such stands must adjoin each other. When two or more stands are allotted jointly they shall be operated as one stand. No other member of the family, firm or company occupying a stand shall be granted permission to rent a stand on the market.
- b. The Board of Public Safety shall have the authority to reject applicants for stands by the following class of persons:
 - 1. Non-taxpayers of the City of Indianapolis and Marion County.
 - 2. Non-residents of the City of Indianapolis and Marion County.
 - 3. Persons convicted of a felony or found guilty of violating the weights and measures law and meat inspection laws, or the rules and regulations of the City Market, or of this and other ordinances relating to the City Market.
 - 4. Standholders who have defaulted on their leases, or whose rent to the city is in arrears more than one year.
- c. No lease shall be sold, transferred or assigned, nor shall the stand leased herein be sublet without the adoption of a resolution by the Board of Public Safety permitting the same to be done.
- d. In the event that any standholder shall not occupy his stand for ten (10) consecutive market days, or shall purchase or sell said stand contrary to this ordinance, or violate any ordinances of said city relating to the City Market, the lease to such stand shall terminate and all rentals paid therefor shall

be forfeited as liquidated damages and said city shall have the right to release said stand.

e. The city specifically reserves the right to remodel and repair said market place, or any part thereof, at any and all times during the term of any lease, and the marketer agrees to the suspension of such leased during such remodeling or repairing and to vacate such leased stand or stands during such time; provided, that the city shall refund to said marketer the unearned amount of rental for the period of such suspension; provided, further, that in the event that such remodeling is of such a nature that requires the vacation of said stand or store, then such lease shall terminate, in which event the city shall refund to said marketer the unearned amount of rental which said marketer may have paid to said city in advance.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

By Councilman Cable:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 99, 1935

AN ORDINANCE amending sub-section (b) of Section 30 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, in order to add a certain area in front of Crispus Attucks Public High School to the list of places set out in the traffic code of the city as places where parking is prohibited at all times, and fixing a date for the taking effect of the same.

WHEREAS, North West Street in the City of Indianapolis is a much traveled and busy street; and, whereas, Crispus Attucks Public High School, one of the large public high schools of Indianapolis is located thereon, at Twelfth Street, and, whereas, automobiles are now at all times parked in front of said high school, bringing about much congestion at said point, and which condition likewise causes a dangerous traffic hazard thereat in that the vision of both children of the high school and the drivers of passing cars is obstructed by such parked cars; and

WHEREAS, for the foregoing reasons the high school authorities and people of the community have urged the members of the Common Council to include the area in front of Crispus Attucks Public High School among the list of places in the city traffic code where the parking of vehicles is at all times prohibited;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That sub-section (b) of Section 30 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

(67) North West Street, on the west side, from Twelfth Street to a point one hundred fifty-six feet (156') south therefrom, being the area in front of Crispus Attucks Public High School.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication as by law required.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

By Councilman Oren:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 100, 1935

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 2 of General Ordinance No. 73, 1933, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Section 2 of General Ordinance No. 73, 1933, be amended to read as follows: Section 2. That Section 2 of said General Ordinance No. 26, 1930, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. That for the purpose of this ordinance any contest participated in by two or more persons, which contest shall continue more than twelve (12) hours, is hereby declared to be an endurance contest, regardless of whether or not there be regular rest periods for the participants during the continuance of such contest:

Provided, however, that any race between two or more persons, shall not, under the provisions of this ordinance be deemed an endurance contest. For the purpose of this ordinance a race shall be deemed to mean a contest of progression and speed between two or more persons.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Law and Judiciary.
