Ordered That Monday next the 10th inst be Set as day on which the Common Council will meet to hear and determine all appeals from the valuation & return to the Lister.

Resolved That the Supervisor have the Bridge over Pogues run on Pennsylvania Street immediately repaird.

Ordered That a tax of $\frac{1}{4}$ of one per cent be levied on real and personal property returned by the Lister and also that a tax of \$1 be levied on each poll and \$1. on each dog returned by the Lister for the present year (1839.)

And the Council adjourned until Monday the 10th inst at 10 oclock A.M. on said day.
