Council met upon call; the President in the chair - Members present Messrs Locherbie, Sullivan, McClure, Seibert, and Norwood.

The principal object of the meeting being in relation to auctions the following Ordinance was passed to wit:

An Ordinance authorizing the licensing of Itinerant Auctioneers.

Section 1st.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis, That a tax of twenty dollars per day, be and is hereby levied on each license to sell foreign Merchandize within the town of Indianapolis.

Section 2nd.

That if any person or persons shall sell at Auction any foreign Merchandize within said town, without having first paid such tax, and obtained such license, he or they shall forfeit and pay the sum of fifty dollars per day, recoverable in an action of debt before the President of the Common Council.

Section 3ra.

That the ordinance for the appointment of a Town Auctioneer, and to provide for licensing itinerant auctioneers, ordained and establish the 10th day, of June, 1839, and all other ordinances on the subject of auctions, be and they are hereby repealed.

Ordained and established this 12th day of September A.D. 1839.

Messrs Sullivan & Locherbie reported on Delaware Street and Mr. Seibert was added to the Committee and the Committee directed to enquire of the Engineer on the National relative to the grade on Washington Street between Delaware & Alabama Streets, and to Confer with him about removing the logs and stone off Washington Street.
