October 7. 1839

Council met on call: present N.B. Palmer President - Wm. Sullivan J.E. McCluer, P.W. Seibert and George Norwood Councilmen.

Mr. Sullivan from the Committee on the subject made a report in favor of removing Blacksmith and other Shops, which may be dangerous on account of fire from Washington Street, which on motion was refered back to said Committee with instructions to report An Ordinance declaring such establishments nuisances.

Mr. Norwood from the Committee on account, reports, that there was due John Carson ten dollars for labor on the bridge etc., which was thereupon allowed him.

Allowed S. Munsell one dollar and fifty cents in full of all accounts up to this date.

On Motion of Mr. McCluer

Ordered That an order issue to each member of the Common Council for twelve dollars being the yearly Salary.
(Palmer Sul Lock McCluer Seibert Norwood Rooker, issued)

Allowed George Norwood one dollar as per account filed for labor done on plough.
