On Motion of Mr Black

Resolved That the throwing of water & filth in and upon the lot known as the Franklin Institute lot by Williams Quarles or under his authority be and the same is considered a public nuisance injurious to the health and convenience of many of the citizens of this town and as such be and is hereby declared a public nuisance; and that the Marshal be directed to take such means to abate the same as is required by law.

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for the preservation of the public pumps & wells and for other purposes" was read amended ordained passed & ordered to be published

Mr Black presented the petition of J Wilkins & others on the burying ground which was referred to Messrs Nowland & Richards.

Ordered That orders issue for officers first quarter salary -

Council met, on call: present all but Mr. Nowland

The President presented the monthly report of the Treasurer which was read and received.

The President laid before the Council the Weighmasters report which was read & received.

The President presented the quarterly report of Wiley & Little Auctioneers which was read and received.

The President presented the petition of William Y Wiley praying to be appointed an Auctioneer when on motion of Mr. Richards William Y Wiley was appointed Auctioneer for the town of Indianapolis for one year.

Mr Richards from committee to which was referred the petition of Charles G. Wilson & others on the subject of reappointing Sexton for public burying ground and repairing the same, reported that they had examined the grave yard and found it in good order and desired to be discharged from further consideration of the subject - Whereupon said committee was discharged.

On Motion of Mr. Black

Resolved That the President be requested to draft and report at next monthly meeting of the council an ordinance to prohibit boars, pigs under six months old and unspayed sows from running at large within the bounds of the Corporation, and also to limit the number, of hogs owned and suffered to run at large to five to each family, owning the same so that no family shall own and suffer to run at large, more than five hogs at any one time.
