On Motion of Mr Loudon

The petition of Dan. King and others praying a remission of part of the fine assessed on John Michael was taken from the table and on motion of the same gentleman all the fine except \$15: and costs was remitted, on condition said Michael will accept the proposition and pay the same without delay.

Mr. Goldsberry from committee on streets and alleys reported in favor of granting the prayer of J. M. Ray and others to grade side walk in front of 1st Presbyterian Church; and thereupon the report was concurred in, conditioned that said grading shall not exceed one foot elevation in front of the church above the centre of the Streets, and descend each way 5/8ths of an inch to the foot and at the line of Market Street to be the height of the established grade

Mr. Richards^K presented the petition of Milton Woolen and others praying the privilege of grading and gravelling the side walks south side of Indiana Avenue between Tennessee & Mississippi Streets which is as follows.

"Indianapolis Oct 6 1842 To the Honorable Common Council of the town of Indianapolis - Gentlemen; The undersigned owners and holders of property on the South side of Indiana Avenue between Tennessee and Mississippi Streets are desirous of Grading and Gravelling the side walks fronting said property and for that purpose pray your honorable body to cause the same to be done under the direction of your survey or within sixty days
