

Mr. Goldsberry from committee on streets and alleys reported in favor of granting the prayer of J. M. Ray and others to grade side walk in front of 1st Presbyterian Church; and thereupon the report was concurred in, conditioned that said grading shall not exceed one foot elevation in front of the church above the centre of the Streets, and descend each way  $\frac{5}{8}$ ths of an inch to the foot and at the line of Market Street to be the height of the established grade

Mr. Richards<sup>K</sup> presented the petition of Milton Woolen and others praying the privilege of grading and gravelling the side walks south side of Indiana Avenue between Tennessee & Mississippi Streets which is as follows.

"Indianapolis Oct 6 1842 To the Honorable Common Council of the town of Indianapolis - Gentlemen: The undersigned owners and holders of property on the South side of Indiana Avenue between Tennessee and Mississippi Streets are desirous of Grading and Gravelling the side walks fronting said property and for that purpose pray your honorable body to cause the same to be done under the direction of your survey or within sixty days

Council met: All present except Mr Boatright.

Mr. Black presented an account in favor of C C Campbell for 50cts for services as Judge of Corporation election 1840 which was allowed

Mr Goldsberry presented petition of Abner Smith to be allowed to make a gravelled or tan bark walk across Delaware street in front of his house, which was granted.

Mr. Goldsberry from committee on streets and alleys reported adverse to the remonstrance of W Y Wiley and others on the subject of side walk west of Delaware Street and asked to be discharged - Report concurred in and committee discharged.

On Motion of Mr Black J M Ray and others were authorized to grade the side walk east side of Circle Street from the front of the 1st Presbyterian Church west on an inclination to suit the ground and present elevation of the Street; provided that nothing in this grant contained shall be so construed as to alter the established grade of said side walk wherever the street in front shall be graded except as allowed in an order of the Council of 8th October 1842 to said Ray and others.

On Motion of Mr. Goldsberry the committee on Markets and Market houses were directed to inquire into the expediency of repealing the 256 section of the ordinance for the regulation of the Markets which requires the payment of 57½ cents for the privilege of selling meat in less quantities than a quarter by any person not a stall holder.

On Motion of Mr Black James Davis was authorized to grade the side walk on Virginia Avenue in front of his property.

On Motion of Mr Goldsberry the Marshal was directed to gravel Cumberland Alley on the east side of Delaware Street where said alley crosses the side walk
