Council met on call, all the members present.

The President laid before the Council the Petition of J. J. Stretcher, John Webb and others, citizens, asking for the improvement of Pennsylvania street south of Washington street, On reading the Petition Mr. Goldsberry moved to appropriate fifty dollars for the purposes asked, which was not carried. Mr. Rooker then moved to appropriate twenty five dollars, which motion prevailed.

And the Council adjourned.

Council met on call, all the members present except Mr. Louden.

The President laid before the Council the Petition of Daniel Yandes, J. Henderson and others, citizens, owning property on Pennsylvania street, praying the Council to alter the present grade of said street. Whereupon Ordered That the grade of Pennsylvania street be altered as follows, to wit: Starting from the ground right in Market street street 29.35. above the base, thence, northward and riseing at the rate of one foot in five hundred and ten feet, until the same grade shall intersect Vermont street, when it will be 32.35. above the base, instead of 33.35. as heretofore established: thence to Michigan street ending with the present grade. Ordered further that the grades at the crossings of Ohio with Delaware streets, and the crossings of Vermont with Delaware and Meridian streets shall remain as now established; but the grades of those streets East & West of Pennsylvania street shall be reduced so as to conform to the grade hereby established for Pennsylvania Street, and that heretofore adopted for Delaware and Meridian streets.

And the Council adjourned.
