Council Chamber Indianapolis March 1st 1845

Council met: all the members present except Mr. Goldsberry.

Mr. Nowland presented the Treasurer's monthly report which was read & received.

The President Laid before the Council the Weighmaster's monthly report which was read  $\delta$  rec'd.

The President laid before the Council the account of S.V.B. Noel for \$30. for Printing for 1844, which was referred to the Committee on Claims. No. 41. Allowed Wm. Wilkerson \$6.50 for hauling gravel on Meridian Street as per act.

The account of Wm Wilkerson for  $37\frac{1}{2}$  cts for hauling lumber from Wests Mill. George Meininger for  $62\frac{1}{2}$  for work done in the 2nd ward. Lawrence Irish for  $62\frac{1}{2}$  cts for work done in the 2nd ward, Nm. Beckman and Frederick Colpeter for 7. work done in the 3rd ward, Nm. Ballenger for 50 cts for repairing foot bridge on Meridian Street and Wm. Moseley for \$225 for plumbing in the 2nd & 3rd wards, were laid on the table.

The President laid before the Council the Petition of the Good Intent Engine Fire Company, praying the Council "to take into consideration the propriety of offering for sale said Engine" "and purchasing a Suction Engine with the proceeds of such sale" On reading the Petition Mr. Louden moved That the President be appointed a committee to advertise said Engine for sale in the Indiana State Journal & Sentinel which motion prevailed.

No. 49. Allowed Jas. Vanblaricum  $3.62\frac{1}{2}$  for removing nuisances up to this date.

The President laid before the Council the following Petition viz: "To the President and Council of the City of Indianapolis

The undersigned, owning and representing nearly the whole of the property upon the West side of Meridian Street, from Washing Street Northward to the north side of the property owned by Wm. Young north of New York Street in said City, respectfully Petition you to pass an ordinance, requireing and providing for the pavement of the side walk, by a pavement six feet wide to be made of brick with proper curbing from Washington Street aforesaid to the north side of the property of Wm. Young aforesaid, and to make proper street crossings upon said line, and also to require the pavement of the side walk on the Western side of the property known as the Circle in said Street, in the same manner and of the width aforesaid.

The Petition being read on Motion of Mr. Rooker it is Ordered That the prayer of the petitioners be granted except as far as the same refers to the west side of Circle Street and the passage of an Ordinance to carry the said petition into effect. Ordered further That the Surveyor and Engineer make all necessary surveys, and set grade stakes for such improvement whereever he may be called u on for said purpose. And Ordered also That said improvement be done by the first day of July next.

Mr. Griffith moved that the Council proceed to fix the Salaries of the officers of the Common Council, for the ensuing year. Whereupon it is Ordered That the salary of the Secretary be fixed at one hundred dollars, The Salary of the Marshal at One hundred dollars, The Salary of the Lister at seventy five dollars and the Salary of the Supervisor at One hundred and ten dollars for the ensuing year, commencing on the First day of April A.D. 1845.

Ordered That the following persons be appointed Inspectors of Elections, to be held in the several Mards, at the places hereinafter named, on the day fixed by law to Elect Corporation officers for the town of Indianapolis for the year next ensueing, to serve from that time until the next annual Election, To Wit:

And that they be notified of said appointment, and the time of holding said Election by Public proclamation.

Ordered That the Secretary issue orders to the several officers of the Council for their 4th quarters salary for the present year also to the members of the Council for their last six months salary for the present year. Ordered further that the Secretary retain of the 4th quarters salary of the Supervisor, an amount sufficient to satisfy the several executions now in the hands of the Marshal in favor of the Common Council against said Supervisor, and issue an order to said Marshal for said amount to be returned to the President together with said executions as satisfaction thereof. Ordered That W. L. Wingate have the privilege of removing a sufficient quanity of Earth from the side Walk on the South west side of Block seventy-nine, on Virginia Avenue, to build a walk on either side of said Avenue from Pogues Run, North, to Maryland Street.

The President laid before the Council an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to regulate the duties of Supervisor of the town of Indianapolis"; and also An ordinance entitled "An Ordinance To amend an ordinance entitled An ordinance to raise revenue in the town of Indianapolis" ordained and established the 14th day of June A.D. 1839, which were read ordained and passed; and the Secretary Ordered to have the same published.

No. 55. Allowed Peter Folsom (3.50 for hauling 14 loads of gravel in 5th ward in 1844.
