

Council Chamber
Indianapolis April 20th 1846.

The Council met, Present The President, and all the Councilmen.

The object of the meeting being to receive the Report of the Committee appointed to revise the Laws and Ordinances governing the town of Indianapolis.

Mr. Harrison Chairman of said Committee submitted, for the consideration of the Council, the result of their labor and further time was extended to the Committee.

The President laid before the Council a petition from Dr. Bobbs asking privilege from Miss Rees to occupy the South room of the Council House up stairs as a school room, which petition was granted.

On Motion the Council adjourned to meet tomorrow afternoon at 2o'clock P. M.

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The Council met pursuant to adjournment, Present a full Council, except Mr. Louden.

Mr. Harrison from the Revision Committee, reported finally on that subject, and the Committee was discharged.

Ordered, That the President of the Council, submit the revision of the Ordinances reported by the Committee, to James Morrison Esq. for legal examination, to ascertain whether the same conflict with the charter of incorporation, or the constitution and laws of the State.

Ordered, That the Secretary be directed to inform the publishers of the Indiana Journal, Indiana Sentinel, and Indiana Democrat, that he will receive sealed proposals for publishing the revised Ordinances of the Common Council until 4 o'clock P. M. Friday 24th April 1846.

Ordered, That the Marshall be directed to make complaint before the President against Hoefgen & Youngerman, and John Butch for keeping a disorderly house under their license heretofore granted them by the Common Council.

And the Council adjourned to meet on Friday Apl 24st at 7 o'clock P.M.
