On Motion Messrs Cady, & Wilkens were appointed a Committee to make settlement with the Collector for the Revenue of 1846 & the delinquencies of former years.

And also, that he be directed to report the amount of Delinquent Taxes, and what proportion thereof, in the opinion of the Collector can be made available.
