Carl Buhl was born in Chicago and remained a resident of that city during the whole of his short but worth-while life.

He attended the grade schools and was graduated, with honors, from the Lake View High School in 1931. While there he stood high in all his courses but showed marked interest and ability in botany.

On entering the University of Chicago he continued his good record, receiving honorable mention for general excellence in scholarship at the end of two years, and, at the time of his death, he was within a few months of receiving the degree, Bachelor of Science, with honors in botany. As a fitting tribute to his worth, the degree was conferred posthumously.

Although only twenty-one years of age at the time of his death, he had already published

two papers on botany and had another in press. He had also made considerable progress in a taxonomic study of the genus Desmodium.
