NEWS

A rubber stamp and Mail Art Show was held on the Artmobile of the Miami-Dade Public Library System in Miami, Florida. The Artmobile, painted by New York New Realist artist Lowell Nesbitt, carries a variety of library materials to the patrons of the Library System. The private collection of Dr. and Mrs. Marvin Sackner was borrowed for this exhibition which roamed through the area of Miami-Dade County showing a new public examples of work of mail artists and rubber stamp artists. • Jesus Romero Galdamez, the mail artist who was imprisoned in El Salvador, has been freed and although in exile in Mexico, at least he is safe.

Now mail artists throughout the world should try to do all they can to find out the whereabouts of Palomo-Abel Louis Vigo, the son of Edgardo Antonio Vigo, who suddenly disappeared thanks to the Argentinian soldiers on 20 July 1976! He was 19 at the time in the prime of life. Up to this moment, there has been no word from him.

- Mailartspace, International, no. 0, was issued in June of this year by c.d.o. in Parma, housed in a ribboned portfolio, with the portrait of Verdi in a sweater beating drums of jazz, in which there are about 60 pages from 100 artists throughout Italy. The circulation is basically Italian.
- c.d.o. has also had an international exhibition of Mail Art in Parma, based on the theme "My Dear...Mail Art, P.O. Box c.d.o., Parma" from 4-18 July, with 60 Italian artists and 100 foreign ones participating.
- c.d.o. will be celebrating its fifth anniversary with *Phon Poems*, *L'Alfabeto*, a cassette tape plus visual poems of Enzo Minarelli, plus a video performance by Minarelli, renowned sound and visual poet, including a new Geiger edition called *Multipoesie Melogrammatiche*, all during the month of October.

- The Mail Art Exhibition, organized by Peppe Rosamilia, was postponed due to the earthquake, and during the month of October will be at the Centro Documentazione Arti Visive, Archivio, Rosamilia, Via C. de Caro, 7, 84083 Castel San Giorgio, Italy.
- The Antwerp Mail-Art Festival, guided by Guy Schraenen, will take place in Antwerp from 25 September to 1 November 1981. On 3 and 4 October, there will be a Mail Artists Encounter, including a round table on the theme, Mail? vehicle? support? ART. During those two days, there will be a mail art workshop, a live performance of Aeropus I, the collective Mail Art sound composition, mail art performances, a space with video, sound and slide installations, and space for performances.

Box 415, 2000 Antwerp, Belgium. This message must reach Antwerp before 2 October 1981 and will be read and displayed during the Encounter.

- A mail art show was held at Detroit Focus from 15 August through 12 September, with work from 5 continents, 25 countries and 20 states, on the theme of Three Great Illusions, Time, Space and Self.
