# FROM THE EDITOR

This is the last issue of *Umbrella* which will contain book reviews of trade books on a consistent basis, listings of exhibition catalogs, and very general art news. Starting in September, *Umbrella* will open with a combined effort, *Umbrella* will combine with a new newsletter, called *Collation*.

What this means is that Umbrella will still appear in its blue cover including general art news, mail art exhibitions and competitions, and some book reviews, but inside you will find another color paper which will be the newsletter, Collation, co-edited by Peter Frank and Judith Hoffberg. You will read reviews of artists' books, artists' publications, records, audiocassettes, postcards, postage stamps, scores, etc., as well as profiles on archives, a minigraph in each issue of a leading artist who makes books, occasional interviews, as well as a listing of all shops which sell artists' books. In number one of each volume of Collation, we want to list all artists' bookshops throughout the world. To this end, we could use your help. We know many of them, but if you know a small shop that sells a few artists' books with a passion that comes from the owner, then send it along to us. We want to be as complete as possible.

There will be several writers working for Collation, but I will remain the sole editor of *Umbrella*. We will concentrate on mail art exhibitions and competitions, as well as general art news. But *Collation* will concentrate on artists' publications.

For review copies of artists' books and publications, we ask that you send one copy to Collation, P.O. Box 3209 Church Street Station, New York, NY 10008 but also to Umbrella, P.O. Box 773-C, Pasadena, CA 91104. This allows the co-editors to work together bicoastally, without too much interference from the postal delays that might incur. So please, if you have a run of over 150 copies, send review copies to each editor of *Collation*.

In addition, due to rising costs of printing, paper and a probable increase in postage because of the addition of *Collation*, the subscription price of *Umbrella* will go up effective 1 October to \$15.00 for individuals and \$20 for institutions. Since you are getting two for the price of one, we don't think that is so terrible, and in fact, this is the first price-rise in three years! So if you renew before 1 October, you can get your extension at the old price. If not, the new renewal price will be advertised in your renewal notice.
