OF THE

COMMON COUNCIL.

CALLED SESSION.

Chamber of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Friday, May 23, 1873, $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock, P. M.

The Common Council met pursuant to a call of six Councilmen.

Present—His Honor the Mayor, Jas. L. Mitchell, in the chair, and the following members:

Councilmen Adams, Bollman, Brown, Craft, Gibson, Hardesty, Kahn, Pressly, Reagan, Rush, Shepherd, Sherwood, Thalman, Ward and Woodburn—15.

Mr. Craft stated that the object of the Called Session was the consideration of general ordinance No. 22, 1873, entitled:

An ordinance authorizing Barnabas Coffin to construct a railroad track over certain streets and alleys.

Which was taken up and read the second time,

When Mr. Gibson offered the following amendment:

To run from along Dakotah street to Pogue's Run.

Dr. Woodburn offered the following:

To extend from Coffin's new pork house along Dakotah street to Pogue's Run.

On motion by Dr. Woodburn, the further consideration of the ordinance was postponed, and the ordinance together with the proposed amendments referred to a special committee composed of the Councilman from the 5th Ward, Councilman Brown and the City Assessor, with instructions to prepare and report to the Council a plat showing the correct route of such proposed switch.

By unanimous consent Mr. Craft offered the following motion:

Moved, That the Street Commissioner be and is hereby instructed to erect pens for impounding hogs, said pens to be constructed under the supervision of the City Marshal.

Which was adopted.

On motion the Council adjourned.
