- 1st. Gentlemen: - The undersigned, owners of real estate on Ohio street between Meri dian and Noble streets, would respectfully remonstrate against the ordinance, No. 230, recently introduced, entitled "An ordinance for grading, graveling, curbing, bouldering and flagging Ohio street between Noble and Meridian streets," and for the following reasons: It is now the beginning of winter, and the street will be rendered almost impassable by the grading at this time. We suggest that the work can be done with greater convenience to all the residents, and with more facility and in a better manner in warm weather than in winter. We beg leave further to say that the street can be greatly improved if the sidewalks are extended to a width of twenty feet. There are now very many finely growing and handsome trees about fifteen feet from the line of the lots, so that a curbstone set at that distance would destroy them, but at twenty feet would leave a handsome grass plat to protect the trees, and furnish an ample roadway. We therefore ask that the ordinance be postponed until May next, and that when it is passed that provisions be made therein for sidewalks twenty feet wide, that the gutters be bouldered, and the street graveled with screened river gravel, and that proper crossings of flag-stone be laid over the streets and alleys.

Lefever & Keating (contractors,) to place in good condition Maryland street from Illinois street to Kentucky avenue, and if the same is not done within ten days, the Street Commissioner is hereby ordered to do the work and report the cost to this Council for collection from Messrs. Lefever & Keating or their bondsmen, and the City Engineer is hereby instructed to withhold any moneys due Messrs. Lefever & Keating until such work is completed.

Harry Craft, Esq.;

Dear Sir:—Please bring up the matter concerning the opening of the culvert under Randolph street. The contractor for the construction of the State sewer is stopped from proceduting his work on account of the water, which stands about eight feet high upon the State lot. Surely, if the matter is not attended to this night, the Governor will bring suit against the city, and you and I will have to help to foot the bill. Please urge immediate relief.

On motion, the entire subject was referred to the Committee on Printing, with instructions to report next Monday night.

Mr. Darnell moved to adjourn.

Which motion failed to pass by the following vote:

Mr. Madden offered the following motion:

Moved, That the Street Commissioner be instructed to raise and repair the stone crossing on the south side of Washington street at the intersection of Meridian street.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Schmidt offered the following motion:

Moved, That the City Civil Engineer have same contractor to replace the boulders where the sewer was built on East Market street between Canal and Pennsylvania streets, and said amount to be collected from J. W. Whitsett. If said amount is refused the City Attorney shall bring suit for same.

Which was referred to the Committee on Sewers.

Also, the following communication:

Indianapolis, December 27, 1875.

To the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Indianapolis:

Gentlemen: - Whereas the repeated freshets during the year 1870 greatly increased the washing of the banks at the curves in the bends of Fall Creek, and suggested the straightening of the channels, commencing at the range line between ranges 3 and 4, at the line between the lands of Mrs. Dr. Bobbs and George Bruce, and ending upon the lands of Powell Howland. That on the 3d of December, 1870, a committee of the Directors of the Indianapolis and Fall Creek Gravel Road was appointed to confer with Mrs. Dr. Bobbs with a view of obtaining land to widen their road at the bank of Fall Creek, and obtaining her consent to cut the channel for said creek across the point of her land opposite her orchard, for the purpose of straightening the channel of said creek. The committee, through Dr. John W. Bowles, got the consent of Mrs. Bobbs thereto, and on the 7th of June, 1871, the company succeeded in obtaining the land for widening their road, and a written consent for cutting a channel, and cut a small channel across the point at the range line, and the taking off of the timber on the proposed line of the new channel upon the two northern points of land, was in the falls of 1871 and 1872. A moderate freshet occurred in May, 1872, and collected a lot of logs, timber and rubbish, obstructing that part of the proposed new channel cut by the gravel road, and no further damaging freshets occurred until June and August, 1875. The Gravel Road Company removed the obstructions from the freshet of May, 1872, but in June, 1875, it was again filled up, and by the continued high water until the first of Angust, the same was not removed until the August freshet came, that further increased it. Since the right to cut the channel across the land of Mrs. Bobbs was obtained, the land at that point has been obtained by the city for the purposes of a park, and therefore the undersigned, owners of the land lying contigious to said proposed straighiening of the channel, would respectfully ask the Common Council of the city of Indianapolis to appoint a committee of said Council, who, in conjunction with the City Civil Engineer, shall examine the propriety of continuing said proposed new channel through the lands donated to said city for the purposes of a park, for the benefit to said donated lands and the owners of the lands adjacent thereto, and report the same to the Council with their views of the same.

Negative—Councilmen Bollman, Buehrig, Curran, Hook, Laughlin, Schmidt, Stratford, Stuckmeyer, Thalman and Ward—10.

Mr. Thalman offered the following motion :

Moved, That the Street Commissioner be directed to fix the west gutter of Ohio street so the water can run off at the intersection of Washington street.

Which was referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys.

Also, the following motion:

Moved, That the Street Commissioner be directed to fill chuck holes on Indiana avenue.

Which was referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys.

On motion, the Council adjourned to meet Thursday evening. December 30, 1875, at 7 o'clock P. M.
