INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCES

- WHEREAS: Certain extraordinary conditions have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, so that it is necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget for the operation of certain functions in the Board of Public Works, and to meet such extraordinary emergencies; and
- WHEREAS: Said Board of Public Works has refrained from and held back the undertaking of necessary projects because of a shortage in anticipated receipts of the Gasoline Tax Fund which could not be foreseen when the 1958 Budget was prepared. There is now available in the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, a sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), from the anticipated, unexpended and unappropriated 1958 balance of the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, and

WHEREAS: It is necessary and advisable to accomplish the projects which have been set aside and which should and ought to be undertaken, from general funds available instead of Gas funds not available, and an emergency exists in order to bring about this start and completion at the earliest possible date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000,00), from the anticipated, unexpended, and unappropriated 1958 balance of the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, is hereby set apart and appropriated out of said fund, as follows:

REDUCE:

Anticipated, unexpended, unappropriated balance of the City General Fund _____\$150,000.00

APPROPRIATE TO:

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS ADMINISTRATION

2. SERVICES—CONTRACTUAL 26. Other Contractual _____\$150,000.00

Section 2. The foregoing appropriation is necessary because of an existing emergency.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.
