(a) Beginning at a point 219 ft. northeast of the east property line of Capitol Avenue and extending 50 ft. northeast on the northwest curb line of Kentucky Avenue for the use and occupancy of the Avis Rental Car Division of Red Cab, Inc., 28 Kentucky Avenue.

Section 2. That said loading zone is hereby declared to be subject to all existing traffic and parking regulations, and to any later ordinances and regulations as may be applicable.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.
