PAPERS FROM THE COMMON COUNCIL-ACTION UPON.

Communication from the Chief Fire Engineer, requesting twelve days' leave of absence, to attend the Fifth Annual Convention of Chief Fire Engineers [see Council Proceedings, page 378], was read, and the action of the Common Council, in granting the request, was duly approved.

Report from Council Committee on Judiciary and City Attorney, reporting upon the official bonds of William M. Wiles, City Treasurer; Benjamin C. Wright, City Clerk; and William Hadley, City Assessor; also, the bond of the Citizens' Gas-Light and Coke Company [see Council Proceedings, pages 381 and 382], was read, and the action of the Council, in approving said official bonds; also, in concurring in the minority portion of said report in regard to the bond of said Citizens' Gas-Light and Coke Company, and in approving the bond of said Company, was duly concurred in.

Motion, instructing the City Marshal to notify the I. C. & L. R. R. Co. to repair Delaware street where their tracks cross the same [see Council Proceedings, page 380], was read, and the action of the Council, in adopting said motion, was duly concurred in.

REPORTS FROM STANDING COMMITTEES.

Alderman Wallace, in behalf of the Aldermanic Committee on Gas-Light, submitted the following report and proposition; which report was concurred in, and the papers ordered to be transmitted to the Common Council, with the recommendation of the Board

of Aldermen, that the Council take favorable action upon the same:

To the Board of Aldermen:

The committee to whom was referred the matter of lighting the Tunnel, beg leave to report the accompanying proposition and statement of the Gas Company, and recommend that a contract be made with the Gas Company for one year, to light the Tunnel, upon the terms suggested by the company.

To Wm. Wallace, Esq., of the Committee on Gas-Light:

Dear Sir:—The Indianapolis Gas-Light and Coke Company propose to light with gas the South Illinois street Tunnel, with 14 burners, of the capacity of 4 cubic feet per hour, during 4,500 hours per year; light and extinguish the burners, keep them in repair, and furnish all the necessary material for such repairs, for the sum of Five Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$550) per year; provided, that the lamps and burners, which are out of repair now, will be put in serviceable order, at the expense of the city, before the taking effect of a contract.

Beg to hand you enclosed statement of the cost of lighting the Tunnel from August 1st, 1876, to August 1st, 1877.
