BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the sum total of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars from the anticipated, unexpended and unappropriated 1960 balance in the Flood Control Maintenance and General Expenses Fund of the City of Indianapolis, be and the same is hereby appropriated

in the Indianapolis Flood Control Department by virtue of the 1960 Budget (General Ordinance No. 75, 1959, as amended) to wit: Appropriation No. 26, Other Contractual.

Section 2. The above appropriation is necessary and the Department of Flood Control of the City of Indianapolis is hereby authorized to use the same to pay for engineering services previously contracted for which payment is now due and which constitutes an existing emergency requiring additional appropriations for the use of the Indianapolis Flood Control Department. Such appropriation shall be repaid from the first available funds of said Board of Flood Control Commissioners of the Indianapolis Flood Control Department.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.

(a) Beginning at a point 65 feet east of the east curb line of State Avenue and extending 25 feet east on the south side of Michigan Street for the use and occupancy of Ja Mor, Inc., 1705-1707 East Michigan Street.

Section 2. That said loading zone is hereby declared to be subject to all existing traffic and parking regulations, and to any later ordinances and regulations as may be applicable.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.
