Mr. Howard Kimball, City Controller, City:-

DEAR SIR: There is balance in the City Hall Building Fund over and above all outstanding obligations, of \$10,268.21, which we had intended to use for the purchase of furniture for the city hall building, but we are now advised by the City Attorney that it would not be proper to use this money for that purpose since it was appropriated to the building fund, and the ordinance not mentioning the purchase of furniture.

The Board received seven bids today for desks, chairs, tables, etc., and have samples of the furniture on display at Tomlinson Hall, which were sent here at considerable expense by the contractors. We believe that an exceptionally good contract can be made from the bids received today, and desire to have such action taken by the Council at an early date as will permit us to contract for this furniture from bids received today.

You are therefore requested to recommend to the Common Council the passage of an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$74,914.67, being the balance in the City Hall 1909 Fund to the use of the Department of Public. Works for the completion and furnishing of the new city hall building.

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL AND SPECIAL ORDINANCES.

By City Controller:

General Ordinance No. 100-1910: An ordinance providing for the transfer and reappropriation of the sum of \$74,914.67 heretofore appropriated to the Department of Public Works to and for the use of said Department, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION I. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of seventy-four thousand nine hundred fourteen dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$74,914.67), being the unexdred fourteen dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$74,914.07), being the unex-pended balance of moneys appropriated to the Department of Public Works under General Ordinance No. 96, 1908, General Ordinance No. 1, 1910, and General Ordinance No. 65, 1910, to be expended for the con-struction of the city hall building, containing offices for the several depart-ments of the city government on land belonging to the City of Indian-apolis, situated on the northwest corner of Ohio and Alabama streets, be and the same is hereby transferred and reappropriated as a fund to be expended by the Department of Public Works for the completion, and furexpended by the Department of Public Works for the completion and furnishing of the new city hall building. • SEC. 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after

its passage.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Owen moved that the rules be suspended and General Ordinance No. 100, 1910, be placed upon its passage. Carried.

Mr. Owen called for General Ordinance No. 100, 1910, for second reading. It was read a second time.
