# SPECIAL ORDINANCE 8, 1929

AN ORDINANCE, accepting the bequest to the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, made in the last will of Margaret Butler Snow, deceased, as probated in the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia on May 9th, 1928, subject to the conditions and terms thereof.

#### PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, Margaret Butler Snow, now deceased, by her last will and testament, which was duly admitted to probate in the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, holding probate court on May 9th, 1928, made a bequest to the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, which bequest is in words and figures following, to wit:

"ITEM XX: All of the rest, residue and remainder of my property and estate, both real and personal, of whatever kind and wheresoever situate, of which I may die seized or possessed, or to which I may be entitled at the time of my death, I give, devise and bequeath, absolutely and in fee simple, one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  thereof unto the Indianapolis Bar Association, to be used, in connection with a legacy to that Association

of my mother, Mrs. John M. Butler, for the establishment of a club in memory of my father, John M. Butler, and the remaining one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$ thereof unto the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, to be used, in connection with a legacy to that City of my mother, Mrs. John M. Butler, for the establishment of a dispensary for the sick poor of the City, in memory of my brother, John Maurice Butler, this legacy to be used for medical aid, nurses, appliances and comforts of every kind, such as chairs, braces, artificial limbs, special articles of diet, and special treatment of every kind."

Be It Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana:

Section 1. That the City of Indianapolis does hereby accept, subject to all the terms, conditions and provisions in the last will and testament of Margaret Butler Snow, as set out in said item numbered 20 in her said last will and testament which was probated in the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia on May 9, 1928, and the City Controller of said city is hereby and herein authorized to receive and receipt for any and all monies, securities or estimates in connection with said bequest.
