Indianapolis March 2nd/51

Council met, present Messrs Eckert, Landis, Louden, Rooker, Hetselgesser, McOuat, & Mr Cully President.

The object of the meeting was the consideration of the payment of the 4th instalment for the building of the four Public School Houses in this City, when on motion of Mr Cully, the following Resolution was adopted.

Resolved, That the secretary issue an order on the Treasurer to William Evans, A Brouse & Thomas P. Cherry for the fourth and last instalment due them for building the City School Houses, so soon as said parties or their legal Representatives shall agree who shall draw the same, and in what proportion.

On Motion of Mr Rooker the following order was passed by the Council.

Ordered, That an order for the sum of \$58, be Issued to George W. Pitts, which is in full of, and for building a Bridge across the Canal on Market Street; according to a contract made with the Councilman of the 4th Ward

The Committees on Streets and Alleys made the following Report which was approposed of by the Council.

The ^NCommittee to whom was refered the remonstrance of certain Citizens owing property on Alabama Street south of Merrill Street, complaining of the grade fixed by the City Engineer, Report, that

they have examined the Street accompanied by the profile, and are of opinion that said Street ought to be graded whenever so done, according to the stakes as they are now set, and many of the persons who have signed the remonstrance, have concurred with the Committee, We therefor recommend that the grade of Alabama Street from Merrell Street to McCartys Street be established according to the accompaing profile.
