Delaware street bridge at Fall Creek, both sides.

Minnesota street at the northwest corner of Minnesota at Madison avenue.

New York street at the northwest corner of New York and Meridian streets.

61st street at the southeast corner of Central avenue.

Meridian street at the northwest corner of Ohio street.

Market street at the southeast corner of Alabama street.

On Monument Circle at the English Hotel.

RESOLUTION No. 3

- A RESOLUTION memorializing Congress of the United States to enact House Joint Resolution 167, directing President of the United States to proclaim October 11 of each year as "General Pulaski's Memorial Day," for the observance and commemoration of the death of Brigadier-General Casimir Pulaski.
- WHEREAS, The 11th day of October, 1779, is the date in American history of the heroic death of Brigadier-General Casimir Pulaski, who died from wounds received on October 9, 1779, at the siege of Savannah, Georgia; and,
- WHEREAS, The States of Indiana, Wisconsin, Michigan, Ohio, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, New York, Minnesota, Maryland, New Jersey, Illinois, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Nebraska, Massachusetts, Georgia, Missouri, and other States of the Union, and the United States Congress have by legislative enactment designated October 11, 1929, to be "General Pulaski's Memorial Day" and,
- WHEREAS, It is fitting that the recurring anniversary of this day be commemorated with suitable patriotic and public exercises in observing and commemorating the death of this great American hero of the Revolutionary War. Therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, and State of Indiana, That the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, and State of Indiana, respectfully memorialize the United States Congress to enact legislation which provides for the effective carrying out of the provisions of the said bill, whereby the President of the United States would be authorized and directed to issue a proclamation calling upon officials of the government to display the flag of the United States on all governmental buildings on October 11 of each year and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day in schools and churches or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies in commemoration of the death of General Casimir Pulaski.

Sec. 2. The Clerk of the City of Indianapolis, and State of Indiana, is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to Hon. George S. Graham, M. C., and Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, Washington, D. C., and to each of the United States Senators and Representatives in Congress from the State of Indiana.

On motion by Mr. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Henry, the Common Council adjourned at 8:55 p.m.
