PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

ADJOURNED SESSION—SEPTEMBER 24, 1879.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis met in the Aldermanic Chamber, on Wednesday evening, September 24th, A. D. 1879, at half-past seven o'clock, pursuant to adjournment.

MESSAGES AND PAPERS FROM THE COMMON COUNCIL.

The following message was received; and the further consideration of the subject-matter postponed:

To the Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis:

Gentlemen:—The Common Council, at an adjourned session, held on September 22nd, 1879, refused to approve your non-concurrent action of the 17th inst., and determind to adhere to its action of the 15th inst., when said Council adopted the following motion, viz:

That the Hospital Board be requested to report whether they intend to comply with the order of the Common Council and Board of Alderman to make a report for the years 1877 and 1878, such reports not yet having been made."

Gentlemen:—At an adjourned session of the Common Council, held on September 22nd, 1879, said body refused to approve your action of the 17th inst., when you amended S. O. 12, 1879. "An ordinance to provide for grading and graveling Madison avenue from Nebraska street to the Jeffersonville, Madison, and Indianapolis railroad tracks," by inserting the word "south" after the words "Nebraska street" and by provided for the curbing of the sidewalks and bowldering of the gutters.

NEW BUSINESS.

The City Attorney submitted the following report; which was concurred in:

To the Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis:

Gentlemen:—In the matter of the improvement of Highland street, from Washington street to Ohio street, by grading and graveling the street and sidewalks, and bouldering and curbing, with stone, the gutters thereof, the Committee on Judiciary, Board of Public Improvements and City Attorney would respectfully report as follows:

We have considered the history of this matter, its references and action had thereon by the Common Council and Board of Aldermen at different times, and we would recommend that the City Civil Engineer be instructed to re-advertise for proposals to do said work in accordance with specifications and profile exhibited at first receipt of proposals.
