WHEREAS, certain extraordinary conditions have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, and certain monies appropriated for certain accounts in the Department of Public Works, Street Commissioner, are insufficient to meet current needs of said department, and

WHEREAS, certain existing appropriations for said department now have unobligated balances which will not be needed for the purpose for which appropriated.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest that funds be transferred from a certain item and fund in the Department of Public Works, Street Commissioner, to other certain items and funds in the same department because of an existing emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the total sum of Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00), now held in the following item and fund in the Department of Public Works, Street Commissioner, according to the 1961 Budget, General Ordinance No. 57, 1960, as Amended, be and the same is hereby reduced.

The above transfer and reappropriation is necessary because of an existing emergency; due to the unusual amount of street repairs required by the heavy winter freeze, and repairs to heavy equipment. There are sufficient funds by virtue of the above reduction in said budget to meet this appropriation and said appropriation will not result in any increase in the total budget.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, be and the same is hereby extended so as to include the following described territory, which is hereby annexed to and made a part of the territory constituting the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, and described as follows, to-wit:

Part of the Northwest Quarter of Section 11, Township 16 North of Range 4 East in Marion County, Indiana, being Lots numbered 12, 13, 76 through 100, and that part of 54th Place (now vacated) lying between said Lots 76 and 85, all in "Moon Meadows" (Now "Brendon Park") as recorded in Plat Book 30, pages 275 and 276, in the Office of the Recorder of Marion County, Indiana, and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the East line of said Northwest Quarter Section extended North with the North line of East 56th Street; running thence West upon and along the North line of East 56th Street a distance of 300.0 feet to the intersection with the Northward extension of the East line of Moonlight Drive in the said "Moon Meadows"; running thence South 00 degrees 36 minutes 15 seconds West upon and along the said Northward extension of the East line of Moonlight Drive and upon and along the East line of said Moonlight Drive a distance of 150.0 feet to the point of curvature of a 49.94883 degree curve (the said curve having a central angle of 39 degrees 23 minutes 00 seconds, a tangent length of 41.05 feet by measurement (58.94 feet by plat of the said "Moon Meadows"); a radius of 114.71 feet by measurement (164.70 feet by plat), and a length of curve of 78.85 feet by measurement (78.83 feet by plat); running thence upon and along the East line of the said Moonlight Drive and upon and along the said curve in a Southerly direction to the left a distance of 78.85 feet by measurement (78.83 feet by plat) to the point of tangency of the said curve; running thence South 38 degrees 46 minutes 45 seconds East upon and along the East line of the said Moonlight Drive and upon and along the extension of the tangent of the last described curve a distance of 92.24 feet to the point of curvature of a 34.24468 degree curve (the said curve having a central angle of 38 degrees 43 minutes 00 seconds, a tangent length of 58.78 feet, a radius of 167.31 feet, and a length of curve of 113.06 feet by measurement (113.05 feet by plat); running thence upon and along the East line of the said Moonlight Drive and upon and along the said curve in a Southerly direction to the right a distance of 113.06 feet by measurement (113.05 feet by plat) to the point of tangency of the last described curve; running thence South 00 degrees 03 minutes 45 seconds East upon and along the East line of the said Moonlight Drive and upon and along the extension of the tangent of the last described curve a distance of 2325.59 feet by measurement (2324.31 feet by plat) to the Southwest corner of the said Lot 100 (the said point being on the South line of the said Quarter Section); running thence South 89 degrees 38 minutes 45 seconds East upon and along the South line of the said Lot 100 and upon and along the South line of the said Quarter Section a distance of 179.29 feet by measurement (181.50 feet by plat) to a stone marking the Southeast corner of the said Quarter Section (the said point being the Southeast corner of the said Lot 100); running thence North 00 degrees 00 minutes 55 seconds West upon and along the East line of the said Quarter Section and upon and along the East line of the said "Moon Meadows" a

distance of 2723.1 feet to the place of beginning, containing 11.667 acres more or less.
