AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Indianapolis to make temporary loans for the General Fund of the Department of Public Parks in amounts totaling Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) at specified times and for specified amounts, for the purpose of carrying on the functions of said Department, said loan to be made in anticipation of and payable out of the current taxes of said Department of Public Parks actually levied for the general fund of the Department of Public Parks and in the course of collection for the fiscal year in which said loan is made payable; to be borrowed at such times and in such amounts as is needed during said period; providing for the interest to be charged therefor; providing for legal notice of temporary loan sale and the time when the said loan shall mature; and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 109, 1961

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Indianapolis to make temporary loans in amounts totaling Three Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$330,000.00), for the use of the Board of Trustees of the Indianapolis Police Pension Fund of the City of Indianapolis, at specified times and in specified amounts, in anticipation of and payable out of the current taxes for the Indianapolis Police Pension Fund actually levied for said fund, and in the course of collection for the fiscal year in which said loan is made payable; to be borrowed at such times and in such amounts as is needed during said period and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 110, 1961

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Indianapolis to make temporary loans in the amounts totaling Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), for the use of the Board of Trustees of the Indianapolis Firemen's Pension Fund of the City of Indianapolis, in anticipation of and payable out of the current taxes for the Indianapolis Firemen's Pension Fund actually levied for said fund, and in the course of collection for the fiscal year in which said loan is made payable; to be borrowed at such times and in such amounts as is needed during said period; and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 111, 1961

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Indianapolis to make temporary loans in the amounts totaling Four Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000.00), for the use of the general fund of the City of Indianapolis at specified times and

for specified amounts, during the six months period beginning January 2, 1962 and ending no later than June 30, 1962, in anticipation of current taxes of the City of Indianapolis actually levied and in the course of collection for the fiscal year in which said loan is made payable; providing for the interest to be charged therefor; empowering the controller to issue tax anticipation warrants to evidence such loan at such time and amount and for such duration as needed, providing for the legal notice of sale, and the time when said loan shall mature; and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.
