APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 3, 1962

An Ordinance appropriating the sum of One Hundred Thou-

sand Dollars (\$100,000.00), from the 1962 anticipated and unexpended balance of the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, to certain designated items and funds in the Department of Public Works, Street Commissioner, created by virtue of the 1962 Budget, General Ordinance No. 80, 1961, as amended, declaring an emergency and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 34, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 9, thereof, by the addition of subsections to Section 4-903, establishing one hour parking meter zones, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 41, 1962

An Ordinance authorizing the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis, to purchase through its duly authorized Purchasing Agent, certain equipment and material to be paid for out of funds heretofore appropriated or available, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 42, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 8 thereof, by the addition thereto of a subsection to Section 4-822, limiting parking to 1½ hours between 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M., except Sundays, on certain streets, and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 43, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 8 thereof, by deletion and repeal of a subsection and by the addition of a subsection to Section 4-822, prohibiting parking on certain streets for longer than

one and one-half hours, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 44, 1962

An Ordinance authorizing the Board of Public Works of the City of Indianapolis, to purchase through its duly authorized Purchasing Agent, certain equipment to be paid for out of funds heretofore appropriated or available, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE

- AN ORDINANCE, appropriating, transferring, reappropriating and reallocating the sum of Sixty-four Hundred Dollars (\$6400.00), from certain specific, designated items and funds in the Executive Department, Office of Civil Defense of the City of Indianapolis, to certain other designated items and funds in the same department, created by virtue of the 1962 Budget, General Ordinance No. 80, 1961, declaring an emergency and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.
- WHEREAS, certain extraordinary conditions have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, and certain monies appropriated for certain accounts of the Office of Civil Defense are insufficient to meet current needs of the said office, and
- WHEREAS, certain existing appropriations for said office now have unobligated balances which will not be needed for the purpose for which appropriated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That certain items and funds specifically budgeted in the Office of Civil Defense in the Executive Department, be and the same are hereby reduced in the following amounts:

Section 2. The above transfer and reappropriation is necessary because of an existing emergency, due to changing plans of Civil Defense on a National level which reflects themselves locally, it is necessary to add additional money into Fund No. 12, Temporary Salaries, because of the help which will be needed to execute Phase No. 1, Phase No. 2, and Phase No. 3 of the Fallout Shelter Program, and the marking and stockpiling of several thousand buildings in the Indianapolis and Marion County area.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and publication as by law required.
