INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

By Councilman Williamson:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 74, 1962

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, General Ordinance No. 140, as amended, and more particularly Title 8, Chapter 9 thereof, by the amendment of subsection 3 of Section 8-903, increasing the maximum height of ground signboards from 24 feet to 40 feet above the ground level, and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Title 8, Chapter 9, Section 8-903 of the Municipal

Code of Indianapolis, 1951, be amended in respect to subsection 3 thereof as follows:

(3) No ground sign board constructed entirely of wood shall be at any point over fifteen feet above the ground level, but when the facing of a ground sign board is constructed entirely of sheet metal, excepting that the supports, braces, battens, ornamental moulding, platform and decorative lattice work may be of wooden material, said ground sign may be erected to a height of not exceeding forty feet above the ground level. Lighting reflectors may project six feet beyond the building line, but in no case shall the reflectors be more than six feet from the sign which they are designed to illuminate.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and publication as required by law.
