I have this day approved with my signature and delivered to the City Clerk, Mrs. Teresa Laffey, the following City Ordinances:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 99, 1962 (AS AMENDED)

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis,

1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 12 thereof, by the addition of a subsection to Section 4-1203(b), providing that notice may be given to persons for the violation of certain ordinances, with reference to the Traffic Violation Bureau, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 108, 1962 (AS AMENDED)

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 8 thereof, by the addition of subsections to Section 4-812, prohibiting parking at all times on certain streets, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 109, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 6, thereof, by the addition of subsections to Section 4-602 providing for one way vehicular traffic on certain streets and alleys, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 110, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 8 thereof, by the addition of a subsection to Section 4-821(a), prohibiting parking, stopping or standing between 3:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. except Saturdays and Sundays, on certain streets, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 111, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more

particularly Title 4, Chapter 8 thereof, by the deletion and repeal of subsections of Section 4-838, prohibiting parking on certain streets between 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., except Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 112, 1962

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 8 thereof, by the deletion and repeal of subsections of Section 4-839, prohibiting parking, stopping or standing on certain streets between 3:00 P.M. and 4:00 P.M. except on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays.

SPECIAL ORDINANCE NO. 16, 1962

An Ordinance annexing certain contiguous territory to the City of Indianapolis, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SPECIAL ORDINANCE NO. 17, 1962

An Ordinance annexing certain contiguous territory to the City of Indianapolis, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCE

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 116, 1962

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Board of Public Safety of the
City of Indianapolis to purchase through its duly authorized Pur-
chasing Agent, certain supplies to be paid for out of funds here-
tofore appropriated or available, and fixing a time when the same
shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indi-
anapolis be and the same is hereby authorized and empowered to
purchase, through its duly authorized Purchasing Agent, the herein-
after designated supplies to be used by the department as indicated.
The said supplies are to be purchased from the lowest and best bidder,
or bidders, whose bids have been received and opened in public by
said Board after advertisement therefor, as provided by law, and the
total cost of said supplies shall not exceed the sum of money here-
tofore appropriated or available for the use of said Board.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
