On Motion, it was Resolved, that the City Narshal be instructed to have the windows in the Council Chamber and engine house be repared, and have the stoves put up, and get wood and have it sawed suitable to burn.

On Motion, it was resolved that a select committee be appointed to draft an ordinance to compel, by proper penalties, the observance of the ordinance in regard to interments of the dead.
