


On motion, The whole matter was referred to this committee on streets & alleys, to report at their earliest convenience.

Council Chamber, Friday Evening November 7th 1851

Council met Present a full Council, save Mr. Buchanan. Minutes of former meeting read and approved.

Mr. Louden offerred for adoption an ordinance in regard to markets, but, upon request, withdrew it, when Mr. Woodward offered for adoption the following resolution:

"Resolved, That the Committee on Revision of Ordinances be instructed to report in the Market Ordinance that markets be opened daily, and that no particular hour be specified for opening the Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday markets, but the Monday and Thursday markets be opened at 12 o'clock, M." Adopted.
