



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

The Committee on Streets, alleys, etc. reported the letting of Bridge over Canal on Maryland Street to Martin L. Coyner for the sum of eighty dollars to be completed within a reasonable time. Report accepted.

The Secretary reported the expenses in the Several Wards by the Street Commissioner for the last nine months ending Dec. 31, 1851 for improvements as follows: In 1st Ward \$232.06, 2d Ward \$177.14, in 3d Ward \$191.92, in 4th Ward \$116.62; in 5th Ward \$106.80; in 6th Ward \$135.62; in 7th Ward \$198.20. Being a total of \$1178.36.

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Also the number of interments in City Cemetery for month ending December 31, 1851 as eight (8) and for the Six months subsequent ending same date as one hundred and eighty five (185).


Mr. Edwards offerred for adoption the following Preamble and Resolution.

"Whereas In the opinion of the City Council of Indianapolis the present tax of fifteen (15) cents on the \$100 worth of taxable property for general purposes is insufficient to meet the current expenses of the city and make the improvements necessary for the comfort and welfare of the citizens; And

Whereas, The City is involved hopel ssly in debt, under the present rate of taxation for general purposes, and that we are paying interest on all outstanding orders; And

Whereas The City Council have to pay at least twenty five per cent more for all work done than if paid for in cash. Therefore,

Be it resolved that the City Council petition the Legislature to so amend the City Charter, as to give the City Council the power to levy an annual of tax for general purposes sufficient to meet the necessary and economical expenses of the City, and gradually to extinguish the public debt, and that the Secretary be directed to present a petition to the legislature, praying the above amendment, together with this preamble and resolution."
