BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That title 4, Chapter 13, Section 4-1303 (2) of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, be amended by the addition thereto of the following subsection, as follows:

Section 2. This amendment shall be subject to the penalties as provided in Title 4, Chapter 13, Section 4-1309 and Title 1, Chapter 6, Section 1-601, of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, Indiana, 1951, as amended.

Stands and restaurants shall not keep open for general business on days not designated as market days, except as the Board may permit; Provided, That stores may keep open for the transaction of business each business day in the week.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 25, 1964

Introduced by Councilman Brydenthal:

AN ORDINANCE repealing General Ordinance No. 13, 1952.

WHEREAS, the Common Council heretofore has adopted and enacted its Resolution No. 2, in the year 1949, which resolution, now in full force and effect, determined the need for low rent housing units in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, and which resolution also instituted the Housing Authority of the City of Indianapolis, and

WHEREAS, for a period of years, from 1952 until the present, by reason of the policy of previous Administrations, the Housing Authority of the City of Indianapolis has remained dormant, and became so after the enactment of said General Ordinance No. 13, of 1952, and which said Ordinance 13 rejected the concept of low cost housing.

WHEREAS, this Council now reaffirms and redetermines the need for an active Housing Authority as provided in the original Resolution No. 2, 1949, which instituted the Housing Authority of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That General Ordinance No. 13, 1952, be and the same is hereby repealed. Further, the policy enunciated under said ordinance that low rent projects financed with Federal assistance be rejected is disavowed and disapproved.

Section 2. That there will occur in this City by reason of the proposed construction of a number of Federal Interstate Highways through the City of Indianapolis, the displacement and dispossession of numerous home owners who will require low cost housing to be re-established and the need will arise to provide homes in place of the ones which will be taken from Citizens in the Interstate Highway program.

Section 3. That the need of low cost housing in the City of Indianapolis with Federal assistance is redetermined and reaffirmed. The reactivation of the Housing Authority of the City of Indianapolis is confirmed and approved. The City Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the Director of the Public Housing Administration at his Headquarters in Washington, D. C.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

the south line of the Northeast Quarter of Section 9, Township 16 North, Range 4 East; thence east on and upon said south quarter section line and also the south line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 10, Township 16 North, Range 4 East, 2425 feet, more or less, to a point which is 450.05 feet west of the center of Section 10, Township 16 North, Range 4 East; thence north 780.43 feet along the west line of lots 159, 160, 161, and 162 in Brendonridge Sixth Section; thence easterly 393.64 feet along the south line of lots 179 and 180 in Brendonridge Fifth Section; thence northwesterly 126.63 feet along part of the east line of lot 179; thence northeasterly along the south line of Lot 178-174.73 feet to the west right-of-way line of Far Hill Road; thence southeasterly along said west rightof-way line 32 feet; thence northeasterly 230 feet along the south line of Lot 172; thence northwesterly 303.88 feet along the east line of Lots 172, 173 and part of Lot 174; thence north 85.22 feet along the east line of Lots 174 and 175; thence northeasterly 238.63 feet along the south line of Lots 175 and 176; thence east 500 feet along the south line of lot 177 in Brendonridge Fifth Section and Lots 104, 106 and 107 in Brendonridge Third Section; thence in a southeasterly direction 252.75 feet along the south line of Lot 113 to a point on the west right-ofway line of Roxbury Road; thence south along said west rightof-way line 232.74 feet; thence east 270 feet along the south line of Lot 122; thence south 127.62 feet along the west line of lot 121; thence east 140.0 feet along the South line of Lot 121 to a point on the Existing Corporation Line of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana (said line being the east line of the West Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 16 North, Range 4 East); thence north upon and along the said Corporation Line to the point of beginning, containing 200 acres, more or less.

Mr. Brydenthal suggested the Council thank Mr. Michael Reddington and Mr. John Dillon, Corporation Counsel and City Attorney respectively, who gave such an outstanding performance in defending the City of Indianapolis before the Public Service Commission against the rate increase asked by the Indianapolis Water Company.

On motion of Mr. Kuykendall seconded by Mr. Brydenthal the Council adjourned at 8:55 P.M.
