WHEREAS, the present classifications of the existing 1944 budget for Funds 11 and 12 of the Department of Public Parks of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, are no longer applicable to a functionalized organization for the management, maintenance, development and operation of a modern department of public parks; and

- WHEREAS, the same do not provide for the employment of necessary maintenance supervisors and qualified technicians, particularly vital to program for postwar development and supervise the maintenance, operating and construction crews; and
- WHEREAS, in order to effect an efficient park development, maintenance and operating department, it is necessary that the arrangement of the items under such funds be changed and modernized as herein provided for; and
- WHEREAS, the appropriation, allocation, transfer and reappropriation of all monies required will not increase or effect current tax levies; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the following sums of money, as herein designated, in the respective amounts hereinafter indicated in the amended budget therefor, be and the same are hereby appropriated, allocated, transferred, reappropriated and reallocated, as of April 1, 1944, to the respective items and designated funds in the Department of Public Parks of Indianapolis under the 1944 budget, as hereby amended, to-wit: To Fund numbered 11, the sum of \$175,609.87 Tax Levy monies, of which sum the amount of \$119,377.96 Tax Levy monies is hereby transferred, reappropriated and reallocated thereto from Tax Levy monies heretofore appropriated in said budget for said Department, and the balance of \$56,231.91 thereof is hereby appropriated from the estimated, anticipated and unappropriated 1944 balance of the General Fund of said Department, AS WELL AS the sum of \$16,247.50 Gas Tax monies, of which sum the amount of \$12,011.50 Gas Tax monies is hereby transferred, reappropriated and reallocated thereto from Gas Tax monies heretofore appropriated thereto in said budget for said Department, and the balance of \$4,236.00 thereof is hereby appropriated from the estimated, anticipated and unappropriated 1944 balance of the Gas Tax Fund of the City of Indianapolis; AND to Fund numbered 12, the sum of \$135,490.00 Tax Levy monies is hereby appropriated, of which sum, the amount of \$158,293.00 Tax Levy monies, less \$22,803.00 which is not reappropriated, is hereby transferred, reappropriated and reallocated thereunder from Tax Levy monies heretofore appropriated thereto under said budget, AS WELL AS the sum of \$39,842.75 Gas Tax monies is hereby appropriated thereto, of which sum the amount of \$37,562.00 Gas Tax monies is hereby transferred, reappropriated and reallocated thereunder from Gas Tax monies heretofore appropriated thereto in said budget and the balance of \$2,280.75 thereof is hereby appropriated from the estimated, anticipated and unappropriated 1944 balance of the Gas Tax Fund of said City; AND said Funds numbered 11 and 12 in General Ordinance 62, 1943, as amended, relating to the 1944 budget for the Department of Public Parks of Indianapolis, be and the same are amended, beginning as of April 1, 1944, to read as follows, to-wit:

- a. Thirty-six (36) foot "loading zone" on the south side of Georgia Street beginning at a point twenty-five (25) feet east of the east curb line of South Meridian Street and extending east a distance of thirty-six (36) feet.
- b. Eighteen (18) foot "loading zone" on the west side of South Pennsylvania Street beginning at a point eightyfour (84) feet south of the south curb line of Maryland Street and extending south a distance of eighteen (18) feet.

Section 2. That the passenger and/or loading zone heretofore established at 38 Virginia Avenue in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, be and the same is hereby repealed and abolished.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
