MINUTES OF THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL AND SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT COUNCILS OF INDIANAPOLIS, MARION COUNTY, INDIANA

REGULAR MEETINGS, MONDAY, OCTOBER 27, 1986

The City-County Council of Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana and the Indianapolis Police Special Service District Council, Indianapolis Fire Special Service District Council and Indianapolis Solid Waste Collection Special Service District Council convened in regular concurrent sessions in the Council Chamber of the City-County Building at 7:00 p.m., on Monday, October 27, 1986, with Councillor SerVaas presiding.

Councillor West lead the opening prayer and invited all present to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

ROLL CALL

Councillor SerVaas requested the members to indicate their presence. The Clerk took the roll call of the Council, which was as follows:

President SerVaas announced that a quorum of twenty-eight members was present.

INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS AND VISITORS

Councillor Dowden introduced Ms. June Beechler, a well known concerned citizen of Indianapolis who has been involved in efforts to reduce pornographic activities in Marion County and Mr. Dale Arnold, Executive Director of Citizens for Decency Through Law of Central Indiana.

Councillor Hawkins recognized members of the Independent Cab Company.

Councillor Journey introduced "the new Glenn L. Howard", father of newborn Glenn L. Howard. Councillor Howard explained that on Sunday, October 26, 1986, he shared the experience of natural childbirth with his wife, Florence.

Councillor Borst moved, seconded by Councillor Rader, to advance Proposal No. 579, 1986, on the agenda. Consent was given.

Councillor Coughenour requested to add a resolution (Proposal No. 673, 1986) under the "Presentation of Petitions, Memorials, Special Resolutions, and Council Resolutions" portion of the Agenda. Consent was given.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Consent was given to the adoption of the agenda of the City-County Council and the Indianapolis Police, Fire and Solid Waste Collection Special Service District Councils of October 27, 1986, as distributed.

PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS, MEMORIALS, SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS, AND COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS

PROPOSAL NO. 659, 1986. This proposal honors Maicel Donnee Malone. Councillor Howard, sponsor, read the resolution and presented a framed copy to Miss Malone, a junior at North Central High School. Miss Malone was accompanied by her father and Mr. James Perkins, representing the Athletics Congress. Councillor Howard moved, seconded by Councillor Journey, for adoption. Proposal No. 659, 1986, was adopted by Unanimous Voice Vote, retitled SPECIAL RESOLUTION NO. 119, 1986, and reads as follows:

CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL SPECIAL RESOLUTION NO. 119, 1986

A SPECIAL RESOLUTION honoring Maicel Donee Malone.

WHEREAS, Maicel Donee Malone won the 100 meter and the 200 meter national championship at the TAC Junior National Championships in June of 1986; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Malone placed second in the 100 meters and 200 meters in the Junior Pan American Athletic Championships; and

WHEREAS, Maicel Donee Malone is now recognized as a Junior World Champion of the 4×100 United States Relay Team; now, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

- SECTION 1. The Indianapolis-Marion County City-County Council honors Maicel Donee Malone for her outstanding achievements in the sport of track and field.
- SECTION 2. The Council further sends Ms. Malone the best of wishes as she continues to represent our City and herself in competition throughout the world.
- SECTION 3. The Mayor is invited to join in this resolution by affixing his signature hereto.
- SECTION 4. This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon adoption and compliance with IC 36-3-4-14.

PROPOSAL NO. 660, 1986. This proposal welcomes the first International Amateur Athletic Federation World Indoor Track and Field Championships to Indianapolis. Councillor Howard, sponsor, read the resolution, presented a framed copy to Mr. James Perkins, Athletics Congress, and moved for its adoption. Mr. Perkins explained that the national headquarters for the Athletics Congress is located in Indianapolis and that the Congress is hosting the IAAF Championships. He estimated that there would be 140-150 nations in attendance. Proposal No. 660, 1986, was adopted by Unanimous Voice Vote, retitled SPECIAL RESOLUTION NO. 120, 1986, and reads as follows:

CITY-COUNTY SPECIAL RESOLUTION NO. 120, 1986

A SPECIAL RESOLUTION welcoming the first IAAF World Indoor Championships to Indianapolis.

WHEREAS, The Athletic Congress/USA selected Indianapolis as the site for the first IAAF World Indoor Track and Field Championships; and

WHEREAS, there will be over one hundred (100) IAAF member nations participating in the Championships; and

WHEREAS, the International Amateur Athletic Federation will host the World Indoor Championships at the Indianapolis Hoosier Dome March 6 - 8, 1987; now, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. The Indianapolis-Marion County City-County Council welcomes the International Amateur Athletic Federation World Indoor Championships to the City of Indianapolis.

SECTION 2. The Council further extends its hand of hospitality to the World Indoor Championships and wishes it the best of success.

SECTION 3. The Mayor is invited to join in this resolution by affixing his signature hereto.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon adoption and compliance with IC 36-3-4-14.

PROPOSAL NO. 661, 1986, supports Mayor William H. Hudnut, III proclaiming October 26 through November 1, 1986, as Pornography Awareness Week. Councillor McGrath, co-sponsor of Proposal No. 661 along with Councillors Coughenour and Dowden, read the resolution, presented a framed copy to Mr. Dale Arnold, Executive Director of Citizens for Decency Through Law of Central Indiana, and moved for its adoption. Proposal No. 661, 1986, was adopted by Unanimous Voice Vote, retitled SPECIAL RESOLUTION NO. 121, 1986, and reads as follows:

CITY-COUNTY SPECIAL RESOLUTION NO. 121, 1986

A SPECIAL RESOLUTION in support of Mayor William H. Hudnut, III's Pornography Awareness Week Proclamation.

WHEREAS, Mayor William H. Hudnut, III has proclaimed the week of October 26th through November 1st, 1986, as Pornography Awareness Week; and

WHEREAS, the flagrant and wanton display of pornographic materials is distasteful and repugnant to the public at large; and

WHEREAS, the promotion of pornographic materials is degrading to women, injurious to youth and disgusting to all; and

WHEREAS, the criminal deviancy, physical abuse, psychological damage and emotional turmoil resulting from pornographic material promotion is beneficial only to society's criminal element; now, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. The Indianapolis-Marion County City-County Council commends Mayor William H. Hudnut, III for proclaiming October 26th through November 1st, 1986, Pornography Awareness Week.

SECTION 2. The Council further commends Citizens for Decency Through Law of Central Indiana for its efforts of the past two years in helping to bring this area of grave concern to the public's attention,

SECTION 3. The Council also urges all citizens of Indianapolis and Marion County to avail themselves of the opportunity provided by Pornography Awareness Week to make

themselves more knowledgeable of the damaging personal and societal aspects of pornographic material.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon adoption and compliance with IC 36-3-4-14.

PROPOSAL NO. 671, 1986. This proposal honors William G. Mays. Councillor Miller, co-sponsor, moved to postpone Proposal No. 671, 1986, until the November 10, 1986, meeting of the Council. Consent was given.

PROPOSAL NO. 673, 1986. This proposal requests the City Controller to review licensed taxicab insurance requirements. Councillor Coughenour read the resolution and moved for its adoption.

Councillor West criticized the resolution, stating that there have been meetings with representatives of the taxicab companies in the recent past to discuss the issue of taxicab insurance requirements. He inquired of Councillor Coughenour if she desired the meetings to continue.

Councillor Coughenour encouraged Councillor West to continue the meetings concerning insurance requirements. She explained that her intent in introducing Proposal No. 673 was to support information from various taxicab companies which indicates that taxicab insurance requirements are costly.

Proposal No. 673, 1986, was adopted by Unanimous Voice Vote, retitled COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 34, 1986, and reads as follows:

CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 34, 1986

A COUNCIL RESOLUTION requesting the City Controller to review licensed taxicab insurance requirements.

WHEREAS, the new insurance limits required of taxi operators appears to be a burden upon this industry; and

WHEREAS, these new limits take effect on November 1, 1986; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council that this situation should be addressed immediately; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. The City Controller's office is hereby requested to review the new insurance limits required of taxi operators as to the effect these limits will have upon

the industry.

SECTION 2. The Controller's office is further requested to present to the Council for introduction at its next regularly scheduled meeting a proposal which would best resolve the issue of insurance limits required of taxi operators.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon adoption and compliance with IC 36-3-4-14.
