APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 7, 1937

AN ORDINANCE appropriating the sum of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$10,550.00) from the unappropriated and unexpended 1936 balance of the Sanitary Maintenance and General Expense Fund to Sewage Disposal Plant Fund No. 44, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL AND SPECIAL ORDINANCES

By the City Plan Commission:

SPECIAL ORDINANCE NO. 2, 1937

AN ORDINANCE annexing certain contiguous territory to the CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS and fixing a time when same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, be and the same is hereby extended so as to include the following described territory, which is hereby annexed to and made a part of the territory constituting the City of Indianapolis, Indiana:

Beginning at a point on the present corporation line of the City of Indianapolis, said point being the intersection of the north property line of 21st Street with the center line of Riley Avenue, said point also being 667.05' west of the center line of Emerson Avenue, thence north on and along the center line of Riley Avenue a distance of 223' to a point, thence east and parallel to the north property line of the said 21st Street a distance of 175' to a point, thence south and parallel to the center line of the said Riley Avenue a distance of 223' to a point on the north property line of the said 21st Street, thence west on and along the north property line of the said 21st Street a distance of 175' to the point or place of beginning.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.

- Section 2. That said purchases shall be made from the lowest and best bidders thereon whose bids have been received after a published advertisement for competitive bids therefor, according to law, and the total cost of the same shall not exceed the sum of money hereinabove set out.
- Section 3. That the purchase prices for said above named materials, supplies, merchandise and services shall be paid out of funds heretofore appropriated to the Department of Public Health and Charities for the year 1937.
- ' Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
