A Regular Meeting of the City-County Council of Indianapolis, Marion County convened in Council Chambers of the City-County Building at 7:15 p.m., Monday, October 20, 1975. President SerVaas in the chair. Councilman Giffin opened the meeting with a prayer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

President SerVaas instructed the Clerk to take the roll. PROPOSAL NO. 413, 1975. Introduced by Councilman Gorham. The Clerk read the Proposal entitled: "A Proposal for a General Ordinance amending the Code of Indianapolis and Marion County, Indiana, 1975, and more particularly Chapter 29, Traffic and Motor Vehicles; Article III, Intersection Traffic Controls; Section 92, Schedule of intersection controls, establishing controls at two residential intersection, establishing regulations, providing penalties, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect;" and the President referred it to the Transportation Committee.

PROPOSAL NO. 414, 1975. Introduced by Councilman Gorham. PROPOSAL NO. 419, 1975. Introduced by Councilman Kimbell. The Clerk read the Proposal entitled: "A Proposal for a Fiscal Ordinance amending the City-County Annual Budget for 1975 (City-County Fiscal Ordinance No. 42, 1974) and appropriating an additional One thousand nine hundred dollars (\$1,900) in the County General Fund for purposes of the Juvenile Court and reducing certain other appropriations for that office;" and the President referred it to the Public Safety and Criminal Justice Committee.

PROPOSAL NO. 420, 1975. Introduced by Councilman Cottingham. The Clerk read the Proposal entitled: "A Proposal for a Fiscal Ordinance amending the City-County Annual Budget for 1975 (City-County Fiscal Ordinance No. 42, 1974) and appropriating and additional Twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) in the

County General Fund for purposes of Central Data Processing and reducing certain other Appropriations for that agency;" and the President referred it to the County and Townships Committee.

MODIFICATIONS OF SPECIAL ORDERS

President SerVaas called for any business that might be handled under Modifications of Special Orders.

Councilman Kimbell moved, seconded by Councilman Cottingham that Proposal No. 369, 1975, be advanced upon the Agenda and placed under Special Orders—Final Adoption.

SPECIAL ORDERS—PUBLIC HEARING

President SerVaas called for Proposals eligible for public hearing. Members of the public were invited to be heard on Proposals eligible for public hearing.

PROPOSAL NO. 399, 1975. No Public Hearing was held on Proposal No. 399, 1975, at the request of Mr. Byrum, attorney for Petitioner, who waived the time limitation for Council hearing. (See letter under

Communications above.) Councilman McPherson moved that *Proposal No. 399, 1975*, be *postponed* until the meeting of Council to be held on November 17, 1975.

The motion to postpone was carried by a unanimous voice vote.

PROPOSAL NO. 396, 1975. President SerVaas urged Petitioners and Remonstrators to step forth and speak on behalf of Proposal No. 396, 1975. Mr. SerVaas served as timekeeper and instructed the Petitioners and Remonstrators that any portion of their 20 minute speaking time could be used for rebuttal purposes in order for all interested parties to have equal speaking privileges. The Council recessed to the Committee of the Whole at 7:30 p.m., and reconvened at 7:35 p.m., in order for Mr. David A. Jester, the attorney representing Dr. Ralph to speak on behalf of the veterinarian petitioning for rezoning of 0.84 acre of land located at 8076 North Shadeland Avenue from an A-2 district to a C-3 classification, thereby making building of a veterinarian clinic permissible. Mr. Jester indicated to Council that the clinic would not be housing animals on a boarding basis, that the clinic would be air conditioned throughout eliminating possible animal odor, that there will be no outside storage of animals or trash and that a scavenger pick up will be provided.

Mr. SerVaas then called upon Mr. Neal Ihrer, Realtor, for the Remonstrators. The Council recessed to the Committee of the Whole at 7:36 p.m., and reconvened at 7:42 p.m., during which Mr. Ihrer representative for the "Days Inn Motel" chain presented objections to the proposed clinic. Mr. Ihrer indicated

that the motel chain presently owns land in the immediate area in question and stated that if the proposed motel were to be constructed close to a veterinarian clinic, the noise level would be detrimental to the resting of clientele and that the odor level during warmer months would be offensive.

The Council recessed to the Committee of the Whole at 7:43 p.m., and reconvened at 7:46 p.m., in order for Mr. David A. Jester to be permitted rebuttal time.

The Council then recessed to the Committee of the Whole at 7:47 p.m., and reconvened at 7:49 p.m., for Mr. Neal Ihrer to be permitted the remainder of his time in a rebuttal.

Councilman Cottingham called upon Mrs. Joretta White, Division of Planning and Zoning, City of Indianapolis, to offer staff opinion and to answer any pending questions that City-County Councilman might wish clarified. Mrs. White indicated that staff was favorable to the application for rezoning.

At this point, Councilman Schneider asked to be excused from Council Chambers for a short discussion with Petitioners, Remonstrators and staff and requested that Proposal No. 396, 1975, be brought before Council at a later period in the meeting.

President SerVaas gave consent that Proposal No. 396, 1975, could be laid upon the table for further consideration at a later opportunity.

(Clerk's Note: Proposal No. 396, 1975, was again brought before Council preceding Proposal No. 386, 1975.)

PROPOSAL NO. 353, 1975. The Council recessed to the Committee of the Whole at 8:00 p.m., and reconvened at 8:01 p.m. After public hearing, and following discussion, during which Councilman Cottingham spoke regarding the Proposal, Councilman Cottingham moved, seconded by Councilman Kimbell that *Proposal No. 353, 1975, be stricken.*

The motion to strike was carried by unanimous voice vote.

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY THAT:

SECTION 1. Section 29-224, thereof, VEHICLES PROHIBITED FROM CERTAIN ROADS . . . with a gross weight of over 11,000 pounds be, and the same is hereby amended by the ADDITION of the following, to wit:

SECTION 2. This amendment shall be subject to the penalties as provided in Chapter 1, Section 1-8, of the CODE OF INDIANAPOLIS AND MARION COUNTY, INDIANA, 1975.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance will be in full force and effect from its adoption by the Council, approval by the Mayor, and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.

President SerVaas announced that *Proposal No. 396, 1975,* was again before Council for discussion, and requested Councilman Schneider's opinion following his discussion with Petitioners, Remonstrators and staff members.

Councilman Schneider announced that after conferring with all parties concerned, no agreement had been reached and made a motion to reject the

Metropolitan Planning Commission's decision on granting that zoning position.

CITY-COUNTY FISCAL ORDINANCE NO. 108, 1975

A FISCAL ORDINANCE amending the CITY-COUNTY ANNUAL BUDGET FOR 1975 (City-County Fiscal Ordinance No. 42, 1974) and appropriating an additional Two thousand three hundred dollars (\$2,300.00) in the County General Fund for purposes of the Juvenile Center and reducing the unappropriated and unencumbered balance in the County General Fund.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

Section 1. To provide for expenditures the necessity for which has arisen since the adoption of the annual budget, Section 5 of the City-County Annual Budget for 1975 be, and is hereby, amended by the increases and reductions hereinafter stated for the purpose of covering increased costs at the Juvenile Center.

Section 2. The sum of Two thousand three hundred dollars (\$2,300.00) be, and the same is hereby, appropriated for the purposes as shown in Section 3 by reducing the appropriations as shown in Section 4.

Section 3. The following additional appropriations are hereby approved:

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after adoption.
