OFFICIAL COMMUNICATIONS

The President called for reading of communications. The Clerk read the following:

FISCAL ORDINANCE NO. 3, 1975, amending the Police Force Budget for 1975 (Police Special Service District Fiscal Ordinance No. 7, 1974) and appropriating the additional sum of \$200,000.00 in the Police Special Service District Fund for certain purposes of the Indianapolis Police Force and for purposes of the Community Development Programs and reducing the unappropriated and unencumbered balance of the Police Service District Fund.

FISCAL ORDINANCE NO. 4, 1975, amending the Police Budget for 1975 (Police Special Service District Fiscal Ordinance No. 7, 1974) and appropriating the additional sum of \$400,000.00 in the Police Special Service District Fund for certain purposes of the Indianapolis Police Force and reducing the unencumbered balance of the Police Service District Fund transferring and appropriating \$250,000.00 in Federal Revenue Sharing Funds for such purposes.

INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSALS

Police Special Service District Council Fiscal Ordinance No. 5, 1975. Introduced by Councilman Kimbell. The Clerk read the Proposal entitled: "Police Special Service District Council Fiscal Ordinance No. 5, 1975;" June 2, 1975]

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A Fiscal Ordinance approving temporary tax anticipation borrowing and authorizing temporary loans for the use of the Consolidated City Police Force Account and the Police Pension Fund during the period July 1, 1975, to December 31, 1975, in anticipation of current taxes levied in the year 1974, and collectible in the year 1975, authorizing the issuance of tax anticipation time warrants to evidence such loans; pledging and appropriating the taxes to be received in said Account and Fund to the payment of said tax anticipation time warrants including the interest thereon; and fixing the time when this Ordinance shall take effect; whereby President Kimbell recommended that the Ordinance be referred to Modification of Special Orders.

MODIFICATION OF SPECIAL ORDERS

President Kimbell called for any business that might be handled under Modification of Special Orders. Councilman Hasbrook moved, seconded by Councilman Robbins that Police Special Service District Council Fiscal Ordinance No. 5, 1975, be placed upon the agenda under Special Orders—Final Adoption. The motion was carried by unanimous voice vote, and reads as follows:

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SPECIAL ORDERS—FINAL ADOPTION

Police Special Service District Council Fiscal Ordinance No. 5, 1975. Following discussion, during which Councilman Kimbell spoke regarding the Ordinance, Police Special Service District Council Fiscal Ordinance No. 5, 1975, was passed on the following roll call vote; viz: 16 Ayes: Mr. Boyd, Mr. Campbell, Mr. Caplinger, Mrs. Chandler, Mr. Durnil, Mr. Elmore, Mrs. Gibson, Mr. Gorham, Mr. Hasbrook, Mr. Hawkins, Mr. Kimbell, Mr. Patterson, Mr. Robbins, Mr. Ruckelshaus, Mr. Tintera and Mr. West. 1 No. Mr. Cantwell. (Mr. Bayt abstained from voting.) Police Special Service District Council Fiscal Ordinance No. 5, 1975, reads as follows:

POLICE SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT COUNCIL

FISCAL ORDINANCE NO. 5, 1975

A FISCAL ORDINANCE approving temporary tax anticipation borrowing and authorizing temporary loans for the use of the Consolidated City Police Force Account and the Police Pension Fund during the period July 1, 1975 to Dec. 31, 1975, in anticipation of curent taxes levied in the year 1974, and collectible in the year 1975, authorizing the issuance of tax anticipation time warrants to evidence such loans; pledging and appropriating the taxes to be received in said Account and Fund to the payment of said tax anticipation time warrants including the interest thereon; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall take effect.

WHEREAS, the Controller has represented and the Special Service District Council of the Police Special Service District of the City of Indianapolis now finds that there will be insufficient funds in the Consolidated City Police Force Account to meet the current expenses payable from said Account prior to the Dec. 1975 distribution of taxes levied for said account; and

WHEREAS, the Dec. 1975 distribution of taxes to be collected for said Consolidated City Police Force Account will amount to more

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than Five million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$5,700,000.00) and the interest cost of making a temporary loan for said Consolidated City Police Force Account; and

WHEREAS, the Controller has represented and the Special Service District Council of the Police Special Service District now finds that there will be insufficient funds in the Police Pension Fund to meet the current expenses for the payment of pensions and benefits to retired members and dependents of deceasd members and other death benefits payable from said Fund prior to the Dec., 1975 distribution of taxes levied for said Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Dec., 1975 distribution of taxes collected for said Police Pension Fund will amount to more than Nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000.00) and the interest cost of making a temporary loan for said Police Pension Fund; and

WHEREAS, a necessity exists for the making of temporary loans for said Account and Fund in anticipation of current revenues for said Account and Fund actually levied and in course of collection for the year 1975; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE SPECIAL SERVICE DIS-TRICT COUNCL OF THE CITY OF INDANAPOLIS:

Section 1. The City of Indianapolis is authorized to borrow on a temporary loan for the use and benefit of the Consolidated City Police Force Account of said City in the amount of Five million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$5,700,000.00) in anticipation of current tax revenues actually levied and evidenced by tax anticipation time warrants bearing interest at a rate or rates per annum not to exceed the meximum rate provided by law, the exact rate or rates of interest to be determined by competitive bidding at advertised public sale as hereinafter provided, and said warrants to be substantially in the form set form in Section 4. Said warrants shall be dated as of the of delivery of said warrants and the interest accruing on the warrants to the date of maturity shall be added to and included in the face value of the warrants. Said warrants shall mature and be payable on Dec. 30, 1975. Said warrants including interest shall be payable from the Consolidated City Police Force Account, and there is hereby appropriated and pledged to the payment of said time warrants including interest a sufficient amount of the current revenues

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to be received in said Consolidated City Police Force Account from the Dec. 1975 distribution of taxes for said Consolidated City Police Force Account, viz, Five million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$5,700,000.00), to the 1975 Budget Pseudo Code No. 000844—Payment of Temporary Loans (hereby created) for the payment of the principal of the warrants evidencing such temporary loan, and to the 1975 Budget Fund No. 084, Character 25 Interest (Temporary Loans) the amount of interest on said principal computed from the date or dates of said warrants to the date of maturity at the interest rate or rates bid by successful bidder or bidders for said warrants.

Section 2. The City of Indianapolis is authorized to borrow on a temporary loan for the use and benefit of the Police Pension Fund of said City in the amount of Nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000.00) in anticipation of current tax revenues actually levied and in course of collection for said Fund for the year 1975, which loan shall be evidenced by tax anticipation of current tax revenues actually levied and in course of collection for said Fund for the year 1975, which loan hasll be evidenced by tax anticipation time warrants bearing interest at a rate or rates per annum not to exceed the maximum rate provided by law, the exact rate or rates of interest to be determined by competitive bidding at advertised public sale as hereinafter provided and said warrants to be substantially in the form set forth in Section 4. Said warrants shall be dated as of the date or dates of delivery of said warrants and the interest accruing on the warrants to the date of maturity shall be added to and included in the face value of the warrants. Said warrants shall mature and be payable on Dec. 30, 1975. Said warrants including interest shall be payable from the Police Pension Fund, and there is hereby appropriated and pledged to the payment of said warrants including interest a sufficient amount of the current revenues to be received in said Police Pension Fund from the Dec., 1975 distribution of taxes for said Police Pension Fund, viz. Nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000.00), to the Police Pension 1975 Budget Pseudo Code No. 000851-Payment of Temporary Loans (hereby created) for the payment of the principal of the warrants evidencing such temporary loan, and the Police Pension Fund 1975 Budget Fund No. 085, Character 25-Interest (Temporary Loans) the amount of interest of said principal computed from the date or dates of said warrants to the date of maturity at the interest rate or rates bid by the successful bidder or bidders for said warrants.

Section 3. Said tax anticipation time warrants shall be executed

in the name of the City of Indianapolis by the Mayor of said City, countersigned by the Controller of said City, the corporate seal of said City to be affixed thereto and attested by the Clerk. Said warrants shall be payable at the office of the Marion County Treasurer, ex officio Treasurer of the City of Indianapolis.

Section 4. Said tax anticipation time warrants shall be issued in substantially the following form (all blanks, including the appropriated Fund or Account, amounts, dates, statutory citations, and other data, to be properly completed prior to the execution and delivery thereof):

Section 5. The Controller is hereby authorized and directed to have said tax anticipation time warrants prepared, and the Mayor, Controller, and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute said tax anticipation time warrants in the manner and substantially the form hereinbefore provided. The Controller shall sell said warJune 2, 1975]

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rants at public sale. Prior to the sale of said warrants, the Controller shall cause to be published a notice of sale once each week for two consecutive weeks in two newspapers of general circulation, printed in the English language and published in the City of Indianapolis, as provided by law. All bids for said warrants shall be sealed and shall be presented to the Controller at his office, and all bids shall name a separate rate of interest for each issue of warrants, or portion thereof bid for, of each Fund or Account. The warrants of each Fund or Account, or portion thereof bid for, shall be awarded to the bidder or bidders therefore submitting the lowest interest rate or rates. In the event two bidders submit the same interest rate for all or a portion of the warrants of an issue, such warrants shall be awarded to the bidder submitting the greatest premium. Any premium bid shall be used solely for the repayment of the principal of and interest on the warrants of the particular issue. No bid for less than par shall be considered, and the Controller shall have the right to reject any and all bids. The proper officers of the City are authorized to deliver the time warrants to the purchaser or purchasers thereof upon receipt from such purchaser or purchasers of the agreed purchase price. The warrants of any issue may all be delivered at one time or in parcels from time to time, pursuant to any agreements or understandings with respect to said delivery by and between the Controller and the purchaser or purchasers of the warrants.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, a motion was duly made by Councilman Hasbrook, seconded by Councilman Robbins that the meeting adjourn at 7:04 p.m.
