# COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR

August 21, 1935.

# APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 26, 1935

To the Honorable President and Members of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana.

#### Gentlemen:

You are familiar with the great desirability of carrying forward the track elevation program of Indianapolis, particularly at this time when the city's expense incident thereto may be reduced by having track elevation made a federal relief project.

Recently the track elevation project filed by the city with the Public Works Administration was denied; and it has been filed as a project with the Works Progress Administration of which Mr. Wayne Coy is Regional Director. Many conferences have been held with Mr. Coy incident to this project throughout the past eight months, and he today informed the City Civil Engineer and myself that if the City of Indianapolis would contribute \$200,000 to help defray the cost of materials, and if a substantial contribution for the same purpose is made by the Indianapolis Union Railway and the Pennsylvania Railroad, both affected by this project, he would recommend its approval to Washington.

The total estimated cost of the project is \$3,058,000, and when completed will be an important and permanent civic improvement.

If it were constructed under the track elevation laws, the cost to the city would be \$1,039,720.00. It would therefore seem to be sound economy to attempt this phase of the track elevation program at this time with the help of the Works Progress Administration and thus secure an improvement of this importance at a saving to the city of \$839,720.00.

I am therefore respectfully recommending to you that the budget of the City of Indianapolis for the year 1936, recently submitted by me to you, be amended to include an appropriation of \$150,000 to the track elevation fund, which will, together with the \$51,000 now available in that fund, amount to \$201,000, to be used as the city's contribution on this project.

It is to be understood that if this project is for any reason disapproved or impossible of accomplishment, the proper city officials will themselves appear before the State Tax Board and request that this item be deleted from the 1936 budget. In other words, your increase of the budget, if you see fit to do so, will be conditional upon the approval of this project by the Works Progress Administration.

There being no response Mr. Carr called on Mr. Virgil Shepherd, governmental research bureau director of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce, who responded and commended the Council for their conscientious work in connection with the budget.

# RESOLUTION NO. 4, 1935

- A RESOLUTION, recommending that funds for the acquisition of Land for a West Side Park be raised by a bond issue.
- WHEREAS, the members of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis are unanimously of the opinion that land should be acquired for the establishment of a west side park in the City of Indianapolis, and,
- WHEREAS, the members of the Common Council of said city feel that such a park would be a permanent improvement to the City of Indianapolis, of lasting and future benefit to all the present citizens of said city, and those in coming years as well, and,
- WHEREAS, the members of the Common Council feel that for this reason it would be for the best public interest that funds for the establishment of such west side park should more equitably be raised over a period of years instead of raising all such funds at the present time,

## NOW, THEREFORE,

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. We, the members of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana do hereby recommend to the Honorable Members of the Park Board of said City of Indianapolis, that a sum of not more than Thirty-five Thousand (\$35,000.00) Dollars be raised by a bond issue, and that the funds derived therefrom be used to acquire land for the establishment of a new west side park in the City of Indianapolis.

Section 2. The Clerk of the Common Council is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to the Honorable Members of the Park Board of the City of Indianapolis.

# GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 70, 1935

AN ORDINANCE establishing the annual budget of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1936, and ending December 31, 1936, appropriating moneys for the purpose of defraying the expenses and all outstanding claims and obligations of the several departments and officials of the city government; and fixing and establishing the annual rate of taxation and tax levy for the year 1935 for each fund for which a special tax levy is authorized, and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That for the expenses of the city government, and its institutions, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1936, the following sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the fund herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same. Such sums herein appropriated shall be held to include all expenditures authorized to be made during the year, unless otherwise expressly stipulated and provided for by law.

Section 2. That for said fiscal year there is hereby appropriated out of the "general fund" of said city the following:

Section 4. No person, official or employee whose compensation is fixed herein under any item, or by any ordinance hereafter adopted, shall have any vested right to receive such amount, except as otherwise provided by law, but control thereover as to any decrease shall be vested in the body or executive having direction over the one affected, as provided by law, and any such compensation shall not be increased except by ordinance and where funds of the city are available for such purpose.

Section 5. That there is hereby levied and assessed on all real estate and improvements and all personal property of whatever description, notes, bonds, stocks, choses in action of every kind and character in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, as assessed and re-

turned for taxation in said city for the year 1935, a tax of sixtythree and eighty-three hundredths cents (\$ .6383) for general purposes on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such property; also fifty cents (\$ .50) for each poll for general purposes; six and eleven hundredths cents (\$ .611) for city sinking fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of such taxable property; two and sixty-six hundredths cents (\$ .0266) for flood prevention sinking fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; two and six hundredths cents (\$ .0206) for war memorial sinking fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; two cents (\$ .02) for police pension fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of such taxable property; two cents (\$ .02) for fire pension fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; eleven and seventyeight hundredths (\$ .1178) for Board of Health and Charities Fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; one and sixteen hundredths cents (\$ .0116) for School Health Fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; eighty hundredths cents (\$ .0080) for Tuberculosis Prevention Fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; five and twenty-nine hundredths cents (\$ .0529) for park and recreation general fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; four and eighty hundredths cents (\$ .0480) for park district bond fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; seven and forty-nine hundredths cents (\$ .0749) for sanitation and maintenance fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; and, five and sixty-eight hundredths cents (\$ .0568) for sanitation bond fund on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property; all of which levies are duly authorized by specific laws.

Section 7. That the budgets of said departments and the expenditures from all other funds of the civil city shall be carried out with the revenues from taxation provided from the several tax levies fixed in Section 6 of this ordinance, and with the miscellaneous receipts of said funds and with the use of portions of current balances, all as indicated in the following tables:

- GENERAL FUND: The above schedule contemplates unexpended appropriation balances of \$200,000.00 on December 31, 1935, and \$24,811.00 Tax from Polls in Miscellaneous Receipts, in order to produce the tax levy required of \$ .6383.
- CITY SINKING FUND: The above schedule contemplates the refunding of \$300,000.00 City Hall Bond of 1906 due July 1, 1936. The total required amount for this fund is \$616,606.25. The remainder of \$316,606.25 as shown in the schedule requires a levy of \$.0611 which is \$.0251 less than \$.0862 levied for 1935.

Indianapolis, Ind., September 2, 1935.
