It will be necessary for us to have an additional appropriation of \$2,600 to our Fund 53—Refunds, Awards and Indemnities. On October 1st the balance in this fund was \$537.97. Out of this fund is paid the weekly compensation to injured employees of the city. At the present time our compensation roll is \$122.35 weekly, so that the sum of \$1,590.55 will be required for this item from October 1st to December 31st.

This fund is also used for the payment of the settlement of claims for damages against the City of Indianapolis. Based upon the amount expended from the 1st of October to the 31st of December for the past

four years in the settlement of claims, it is my opinion that we will need at least \$1,000 for this purpose.
