Council Chamber Indianapolis March 26, 1841

Council met - present Messrs Little, Goldsberry, Cox Seibert and Norwood Councilmen.

Mr. Norwood in the chair.

James Morrison and others presented a petition on the subject of side walks in the words and figures following towit: To the Honorable the President and Common Council of the Town of Indianapolis:

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent that they are the owners of the lots & parts of lots annexed to their respective names lying on the East side of Illinois Street in said town between Washington Street and the north half of lot number seven in square no. twenty six and that they are desirous of improving said street between said points, by grading and gravelling the side walk on said side of said Street: and are willing to make such improvement themselves so far as their respective lots and parts of lots extend:

Your petitioners therefore pray the Common Council to cause the aforesaid improvement to be made according to such plan as they may deem expedient according to the provision of "An Ordinance to provide for the improvement of the side walks" ordained and established the 10th day of June A.D. 1839.

And your petitioners will ever pray etc.

The above being owners of a majority of the whole number of feet owned between the points named in said petition, said prayer of said petition is granted and said petitioners are authorized (if necessary) to take gravel and sand from Louisiana Street near Morris Morris' to be used in said work, Ordered that the Town Surveyor and Engineer make all necessary surveys and plats to enable said petitioners to complete said work according to the provision named in the ordinance to provide for side walks refered to in said petition and further unless said petitioners shall complete said grading and gravelling within sixty days that the Marshal cause the same to be done according to provisions and requistions of the Ordinances of the Common Council of Indianapolis.

John L. Richmond presented a petition praying the Council to permit him to raise the grade in front of his property on Meredian Street eight inches:

Ordered that the prayer of said petition be granted; the Council however reserving the right at any time hereafter to reduce the grade of said side walk.
