Council met: present a full Council.

Mr Black from the Committee on claims reported the account of Charles B. Davis for \$9.95 and recommended the allowance thereof: Whereupon C B Davis was allowed \$9.95 as per account (Issued 1 June 1848)

Mr Black from same committee reported favorably on the account of Davis & Childers Whereupon Davis & Childers was allowed \$58.18 for labor as per account filed - (Issued 9 May)

On Motion of Mr Black the account of N. Little was taken from the table when on motion of Mr. Goldsberry Matthew Little was allowed \$0:12 in full of said account. (Issued 25c. May 1848)

The President laid before the Council the petition of George Plant and others Butchers of the town of Indianapolis on the subject of the stalls in the Market houses which was referred to the committee on Markets & Market houses.

Mr Richards presented the Treasurers report which was concurred in.

Mr Richards presented the account of H.P. Todd for \$11.95 which on motion of Mr. Loudon was referred to the committee on Wells.

Mr Nowland presented the application of J M W Langsdale for license to keep a Grocery in the town of Indianapolis:

Ordered that the Secretary issue License to J M W Langsdale to vend spirituous and strong liquors by retail in the town of Indianapolis for one year from 7. March 1842 upon said Langsdales complying with the ordinances of said town.

Allowed William Adams \$1:50 as per account filed for labor
(Iss. 9 May)

Mr Loudon presented an account in favor of Jones & Ramsay for \$10. which was referred to committee on Fire department.

Mr Goldsberry from the committee on claims reported back the account of Isaac Kinder for \$5: When on motion allowed Isaac Kinder \$5: in full of said account.

Allowed Michael Shea 70:57 $\frac{1}{2}$ as per account for work.

On Motion of Mr Black - Mr Footright was appointed a committee wait on the late Marshal and procure the last years delinquent road list.

The President laid before the Council the Weighmaster's report which was concurred in.

Ordered That the Secretary issue an order in favor of R.C. Allison the Supervisor for the road tax belonging to each ward as appears by the late Supervisors report

(Iss. for \$141: the amt. of road tax in Treas. hands belonging to the six wards this 12 May 1842.)

Allowed R.C. Allison \$2:45 as per account filed for money paid for removing nuisances etc.

(Issued 12 May)

And the Council adjourned to meet at 4 oclock P.M. on the 10th May 1842.
