Council met present a full Council.

On motion of Mr Loudon The Council proceeded to appoint a Secretary for the Common Council -

Whereupon William L. Wingate was duly appointed Secretary of the Common Council for one year.

On motion of Mr Rooker The Council proceeded to appoint a Treasurer for the Common Council

Whereupon Charles B. Davis was duly appointed Treasurer of the Common Council for one year.

On Motion of Mr Loudon The Council proceeded to appoint an assessor of the town of Indianapolis

Whereupon Thomas Donnellan was duly appointed assessor of the town of Indianapolis for one year.

On Motion of Mr Récharé The Council proceeded to appoint a clerk of the Market for the East Market

Whereupon Israel Jennings was duly appointed Clerk of the East Market in said town

On motion of Mr Loudon The Council proceeded to appoint a clerk of the Market for the West Market

Whereupon Israel Jennings was duly appointed Clerk of the Market for the West Market

On motion of Mr. Black The Council proceeded to appoint a Weighmaster in the town of Indianapolis

Whereupon John Patton was duly appointed Weighmaster of said town

On motion of Mr Loudon The Council proceeded to appoint a Supervisor of Streets & alleys in the town of Indianapolis

Whereupon Thomas M Weaver was duly appointed Supervisor of Streets and Alleys in said town.

On motion of Mr Black The Council proceeded to appoint a Town Surveyor & Engineer for the town of Indianapolis

Whereupon Luke Nunsell was duly appointed Town Surveyor and Engineer.

On motion of Mr Richards The Council proceeded to appoint a Sexton to the Public Grave Yard

Whereupon John Masgrove was duly appointed Sexton of the Public Grave Yard.

On Motion of Mr. Richards

Resolved That the Council proceed to the choice of some fit person to act as messenger to the Fire department to serve as such for one year unless sooner removed or dismissed by a majority of the Common Council and that he be allowed the sum of fifty dollars per year payable quarterly.

Whereupon David Cox was duly appointed such messenger for the Fire Department.

On motion of Mr Richards

Resolved That S.A. Ballingall be permitted to have the use of the South Room on the Second floor of the Council Chamber, called the Engine Room on paying as rent therefor the sum of two dollars per month into the Treasury: provided however that S.A Ballingall is to give possession of said Room at any time upon being notified by the Council one month prior to the time fixed for his leaving said room.

And the Council adjourned
