Council Chamber Indianapolis April 1st 1843

Council met: All the members present

The President laid before the Council the Treasurers monthly report; which was read and recieved.

Mr. Rickards from the Committee on the fire department reported the following accounts which were considered and allowed

To Milton Foudray for three days work on Engine \$3.00 (77)

To William Balenger for three days work on Engine \$3.00 (Issued 73)

" Montague & Buchanan for repairs to hose carriage 1.50 (82)

The Presdent laid before the council his quarterly report of proceedings had before him, and the moneys collected and paid over to the Treasurer for the same period, ending 1st April 1843; also his account of fees due for said quarter, which was read and recieved

Allowed to D V. Culley, Presdent the sum of \$1.37, the amount of his account for fees for one quarter, ending April 1st 1843 (76)

Mr. Goldsberry, from committee on claims, reported in favor of allowing the account of J L. Mothershead for oil; and the sum of 75cts was allowed him as per bill filed (97)

The President announced the appointment of the following standing committees

On the Fire Department - Messrs Goldberry, Black & Louden

On Claims - Black, Rickards and Nowland

On Streets, alleys and side walks - Messrs Louden, Black & Rooker

On Public Wells, Pumps & Cisterns - Messrs Black, Nowland & Louden

On Markets and Market houses - Messrs Rooker Goldsberry and Rickards

The President presented the Weighmasters monthly report; which was read and recieved

On Motion of Mr Rickards

Resolved, That the committee on Public Wells Pumps and Cisterns, be and they are hereby authorised and directed to advertise and recieve proposals for keeping the same in repair for one year and report the result at the next meeting of the Council

Mr Rooker presented the petition of W F. Slater. E. Hedderly and some hundred others, citizens of the City of Indianapolis, praying the Common Council to reinstate Jeremiah Wormegem in the station of Market Master to the East and West Markets On reading the petition Mr Rooker moved to reconsider the vote of yesterday, appointing Iisrael Jennings Market Master to the East and West Markets; which motion, after some debate was carried in the affirmative, four to two. The question then recurring on the appointment of Mr Jennings, it was decided in the negative by a like vote.

Mr Louden then nominated Mr Wormegem and Mr Goldsberry Mr Jennings, for market master to the East and West Markets; the vote being taken viva voce Mr Wormagem received five votes and Mr Jennings one vote as follows: for Wormegem - Messrs Black, Louden, Rickards, Nowland and Rooker: for Jennings Mr Goldsberry, Whereupon Mr Wormegem was declared duly appointed

On Motion of Mr Black

Resolved, That Hervey Brown, late Secretary of the Council has faithfully discharged the duties of said office, and that the thanks of the Council are hereby tendered to him for such faithful performance of duty

Which resolution was addopted unanimously, and ordered that the Secretary furnish Mr Brown with a copy of said resolution
