Council Chamber Indianapolis May 16th 1845.

Council met upon a call. Present Joseph A. Levy President, Messrs. Montague, Goldsberry, Nowland, Louden & VanBlaricum.

The object of the meeting being the consideration of the injunction laid upon the opening of New York Street by the Marion County Circuit Court.

On Motion of Mr. Goldsberry. It was Resolved, That the Council authorize and empower Harey Brown Esq. to take an appeal from the decision of the Circuit Court of Marion County granting an injunction to stay the proceedings of the Supervisor of the Corporation to open New York Street to the donation line, to the Supreme Court for final adjustment: And that the president of the Councib, enter his name as their Security upon the appeal bond.

Resolved further.

That Henery Brown Esq. be authorized, to oppose on behalf of the Council, any procedure in any Court of law on equity, having for its object the vacation of Market Street.

Ordered, That John & Mathew Little, have privilege to construct a gutter in front of the property owned by them, and to use the earth derived therefrom in grading their sidewalks.

Mr. VanBlaricum, from the committee on Streets, alleys & Side Walks requested privilege for the Citizens interested in building a bridge across the Central Canal on Maryland Street to construct the same, which was granted.

On Motion the Council adjourned.
