

Council Chamber
Indianapolis July 12th 1845.

The Council met upon a call -- President Jos. A. Levy, Present,
& all the Members of the Council.

Mr. Griffith from the Committee appointed at last regular Meeting to confer with the Engineer on the application of Messrs. Ray, Wright & Willard, relative to an Order passed by the Common Council on the 1st. day March last, to cause certain Side Walks ---- to be paved, reported verbally that the Committee had had the Subject under consideration, and would recommend the revocation of so much of the Order as required the paving of the Side Walks on Square No. thirty five, according to the request of the applicants -- which report was concurred in.

On Motion of Mr. Vanblaricum

Resolved, that a Committee of two be appointed to wait upon and confer with the Town Engineer, On the expediency of making two Surveyors -- One from the Canal, at or near Streets & Co's Paper Mill, to the Circle -- And the other, from some suitable point at Pogues Run to the Circle -- to ascertain which would be the most practicable and less expensive way by which water could be brought to the circle, to be used in cases of fire - And that the Committee report their proceedings herein to the Council at its next regular Meeting.

The President appointed Messrs. Vanblaricum & Goldsberry said Committee.

On Motion of Mr. Louden

Resolved, - That the Sexton of the lower Grave Yard be, and he is hereby, directed to remove, upon the application of the proper person, such graves as may be in the walks or alleys of Said grave yard within the enclosures of the Same, at the expense of the Corporation.

Mr. Helm presented himself before the Council, with a Specimen of Water lime suitable for cementing purposes, after some consideration It was On Motion of Mr. Goldsberry, Resolved that a Committee of 3 be appointed to confer with Mr. Helm, as to the probable cost of cementing the Public Cisterns.

The President appointed Messrs. Louden, Griffith & Nowland. Said Committee

On Motion the Council adjourned.
